

Warren Tells GOP To Accept Social Progress

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Gov. Earl Warren of California told Republicans bluntly Thursday they cannot "turn the clock back" and expect to win this year's presidential election.

Warren, an announced candidate for the GOP Presidential Nomina-

tion, opened his party's national committee meeting with a lunch-eon speech.

He outlined "liberal" platform plank which said his party must adopt if it expects to get a majority in the November election.

"I am convinced the American people are not Socialists and will not tolerate socialist government, but they definitely are committed to social progress," Warren declared in a prepared address.

"Any party which turns its back on social progress will be repudiated by the people."

Warren made no mention of Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio, another GOP presidential candidate. But it was obvious his remarks were directed primarily toward national committee members who are backing the Ohioan's bid for the nomination.

Warren said he thinks the people want "a thorough reorganization and overhauling of the federal government," adding that "the Democratic Party cannot do that at this late date."

Senate Asked To Ratify Two Foreign Pacts

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman Thursday formally asked the Senate to ratify the treaty of peace with Japan, signed at San Francisco Sept. 8.

At the same time, he asked ratification of:

1. The Security Treaty between the U.S. and Japan, signed at San Francisco last Sept. 8.
2. The Mutual Defense Treaty between the U.S. and the Republic of the Philippines, signed at Washington last Aug. 30.
3. The Security Treaty among Australia, New Zealand and the U.S., signed at San Francisco last Sept. 1.

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman asked the Senate Thursday to ratify an agreement bringing Greece and Turkey into the North Atlantic Pact.

The President said in a message: "It is my firm belief that the expansion of the North Atlantic Treaty at this time to include Greece and Turkey—two countries which have been collaborating so effectively with the other members of the free world in building the structure of peace—is a requisite step in the furtherance of the treaty's objectives."

Arrest Of 2 Teen-Agers Clears 55 Burglaries

PORTLAND (AP) — Two teen-age Portlanders were jailed Wednesday night and detectives announced solution to at least 55 burglaries, including a \$4,000 safe-broking.

Detective Capt. William D. Browne said the two—William Dean Morris, 18, and Robert Charles Poitras, 19—admitted a year-long crime wave and gave the details on some of their disappearances which had puzzled police.

Pupils Develop Oleo Taste, Dairymen Told

GEARHART (AP) — The Oregon Dairyman's Association was told here Monday that children are developing a taste for oleomargarine because it is being served in public schools.

Arthur Ireland, chairman of the Marketing Committee, told the dairymen's convention that the practice of using oleo in school lunch programs is spreading even to rural areas.

L. L. Lombard, Eugene, urged the group to promote its own products and not criticize other industries. He said last year's legislative dispute over the butter-oleo question was worth millions of dollars to the oleo industry.

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Acheson Scores Disarmament Offer Of Reds

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State Acheson, blasting new Soviet disarmament proposals, accused the Russians Wednesday of seeking only a "paper prohibition" against atomic weapons. He said they offered no assurance of agreeing to a control system which would assure prohibition of such weapons.

Acheson spoke out in a new conference discussion of Soviet propositions placed before the United Nations in Paris.

He said the United States would examine the Russian ideas but that international inspection which the Soviets are now talking about has never been regarded as an adequate safeguard against the illegal possession of atomic weapons in defiance of some future control system.

Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Vishinsky has offered to accept international control at the same time a ban on atomic weapons goes into effect and to accept continuous international inspection of atomic facilities instead of only periodic inspection.

Acheson said that the Russians, even on inspection, would bar interference in the domestic affairs of any state so that the Soviet Union "would appear to give with one hand (in agreeing to inspection) what it takes away with the other."

A key requirement in this respect, Acheson said, is a provision of the plan supported by a majority of the United Nations for creation of an international control agency which would own all atomic materials and own and op-

erate all atomic facilities using materials in dangerous quantities.

Baby-Sitter Slayer Will Get Mental Exam

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The 16-year old baby sitter who strangled a child left in her care is under observation in Camarillo State Hospital for Mental Patients.

She was committed Wednesday. Doctors' reports will determine whether she is to be placed under jurisdiction of the juvenile court, the psychopathic court or the criminal court.

The girl, Delora Mae Campbell, said she had an "irresistible impulse" to kill Donna Joyce Isbell, 6.
