Two Northwest States To Resist Proposed Dams

VANCOUVER, Wash.—Oregon and Washington interests, opposed to construction of dams on the Lower Columbia River's tributaries, will ask the 15 other land grant states to join them in a legal fight against the dams.

That was decided here Sunday when Oregon and Washington groups met to map opposition to construction of Pelton Dam in the Deschutes River in Central Oregon and two dams on the Cowlitz in Southeast Washington.

The group said that the Federal Power Commission's recent licensing of construction of the dams was a violation of states' rights.

The commission last year granted the City of Tacoma a license to build the Cowlitz dams. Portland General Electric Company was licensed to build Pelton Dam.

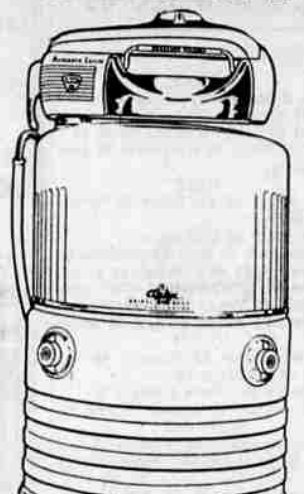
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
