

NEW AERO WILLYS SEDAN INTRODUCED BY DEALERS; HAS 90 FEATURES, GOES UP TO 35 MILES PER GALLON



THE AERO WILLYS, above, the latest addition to the passenger car field, is now on display at Riverside Motors, 1444 N. Stephens St. The car is equipped with an F-head engine, which has provided 35 miles per gallon of gasoline on test runs. Body lines are designed to reduce wind resistance, and tail fins on the rear fenders reduce air turbulence. It provides seating capacity for six adults, though the exterior width measures 72 inches.

Navy Itemizes Red Destruction

The Navy's program of sustained interdiction against Communist forces in Korea observed its first anniversary last week. Cumulative enemy damage totals for the past twelve month period revealed that combined Naval air and surface attacks had accounted for the destruction or damage of 2379 bridges, 4519 vehicles, 7028 items of rail rolling stock and 4674 separate rail cuts. The major share of the interdiction duty has been shouldered by the fast carrier force, Task Force 77, which cruises constantly off the East Coast in the Sea of Japan. Carrier-based Naval aircraft

flew nearly 29,000 interdiction sorties during the 12 month period. Pilots flying Skyraider divebombers, Corsair Fighters and Panther and Banshee jets from carriers have been able to attack all sectors of the Navy's area with effectiveness. The Commander Naval Forces Far East is generally responsible for the Eastern half of North Korea northward from the present battle line to the Manchurian border, a distance of about 300 miles.

White Potatoes Face Price Rollback Jan. 28

WASHINGTON (AP)—The government announced Wednesday that retail prices for white potatoes will be rolled back Jan. 28 to reflect the lower ceilings at the farm-shipping level.

Price Stabilizer Michael V. DiSalle said the order setting the maximum retail markups will be issued within the next few days. These markups will take into account the average 5 to 10 per cent cut in country shipping point prices ordered to take effect Jan. 19. Office of price stabilization officials explained that the Jan. 28 date for the retail price action will give stores an opportunity to dispose of potatoes they may have bought at prices higher than the new ceilings. The officials said that after Jan. 28 retailers will be required to compute new prices weekly to reflect their average costs in buying potatoes the previous week.

Rubber Act Extension Requested By Truman

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman advised Congress Monday that a substantial stockpile of natural rubber has been accumulated, and said that if international conditions do not worsen "it may be possible to begin soon to taper off" buying for that purpose.

Mr. Truman made the statement in a message which: 1. Asked an extension for two years of the Rubber Act of 1948, and 2. Renewed the recommendation he made two years ago that the government be authorized to sell its synthetic butyl rubber plants to private industry.

Shortages Discovered In U.S. Grain Program

WASHINGTON (AP)—Comptroller General Lindsay C. Warren told senators Friday he had ordered a "full and complete investigation" of shortages in the Agriculture Department's grain storage program, after his auditors found shortages of more than \$3,800,000 in a single office at Dallas, Tex.

Sculptured Hands Of Poet, Wife Stolen

WACO, Tex. — The "clasped hands," famed bronze sculpture of the hands of English Poet Robert Browning and his wife, were discovered stolen Tuesday. They had been on display in the "Foyer of Meditation" in Baylor University's Armstrong Browning Library here. The custodian found the heavy plate glass of the case broken and then hands missing. The shrine to the English poet was dedicated only last Dec. 3. The clasped hands were made in 1853 by Harriet Hosmer, an admirer and contemporary of the famed English poet.

British Vote For Sunday As Day They Like Best

LONDON (AP)—Sunday won first place in a poll to determine which day of the week the British like the most. Saturday finished a close second and Blue Monday ended up just where you'd expect, said the British Mass Observation Bulletin. The 33 per cent who placed Sunday No. one on their hit parade explained in general that they liked its passive, leisureed, "do as you please" atmosphere. The 26 per cent who plumped for Saturday did so because it is "active, exciting and colorful, with plenty of shopping, sport, film and theatre going." Blue Monday was picked for last place by a solid 32 per cent of those polled.
