Russians Pay Heavily To Get U. S. Magazine

NEW YORK — Gen. Walter Bedell Smith, director of the Central Intelligence Agency, said Thursday night the Russian people pay black market prices to get hold of an American magazine.

They are "so eager to learn of the outside world," Smith said, that they pay \$1.50 a page for copies of the magazine "America" on "the black market."

The State Department distributes the magazine to persons approved by the Soviet government, he said, but somehow copies eventually reach non-approved persons.

Jessup Target Of Sen. Bridges In New Attack

WASHINGTON — Senator Bridges (R-Nh.), the Republican floor leader, said Friday he was confident the Senate would vote against Ambassador Philip Jessup as a United Nations delegate if the issue could be brought to the floor.

Bridges launched a new attack on Jessup in a Senate speech late Thursday after Andrei Vishinsky, the Soviet Foreign Minister, had expressed "sympathy" with Jessup because of GOP denunciations of him.

The New Hampshire senator said Vishinsky and "his pal, Mr Jessup," had put on a "footsie tootsie" exhibition at the U.N. meeting in Paris, and added: "Obviously if Jessup is satisfactory to Vishinsky and Russia, he can't be satisfactory to the United States."

Majority Leader McFarland (D-Ariz.) retorted that the "Russians are very shrewd in the remarks they make."

"If they want to condemn a man," he said, "they brag about it will be taken up and that the American people will say, 'if the Russians agree to it, we ought to get rid of him.'"

Vishinsky referred to a resolution introduced in the Senate last week by Bridges and 37 other Republican senators. It would have the Senate advise President Truman that Jessup "does not com-

mand the confidence of the American people."

Andy Duncan, whose basketball career was halted last year when he fractured a leg in NBA play, is now living in Rochester and is
