Lie Detectors' Use Stopped, Morse Says

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Morse (R-Ore.) said Thursday that use of lie detectors on job applicants has been stopped in the Defense Department following a protest he lodged.

Describing use of the device as "repugnant, foreign and outrageous," Morse said if other government agencies do not stop using them, he will introduce legislation to make them do so.

He did not name other agencies he said are using lie detectors but the Atomic Energy Commission has acknowledged employing them in security checks at the Oak Ridge, Tenn., installation.

Defense Chiefs Ready For 5,000 Youths For UMT

WASHINGTON (AP) — Defense Chiefs testified Thursday they could begin taking 5,000 youths monthly for limited universal military training (UMT) by next October or November, if Congress approves.

Secretary of Defense Lovett and Assistant Secretary Ana Rosenberg strongly endorsed a plan to begin UMT with 60,000 volunteers between 17 and 19 years old.

They told the House Armed Services Committee they could start this program at no additional expense, if trainees immediately began 18 months' service upon graduation.

Mrs. Rosenberg testified that the military forces would need the additional 60,000 men to meet planned increases and would have to train them for the services if they did not get UMT instruction.

Meanwhile the Senate Armed Services Committee announced it would take up the House-approved bill to raise pay of military personnel, before it starts hearings on UMT.

The pay bill proposes a 10 per cent raise for all personnel.

Britain Will Get Steel, U. S. Aluminum And Tin

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman and Prime Minister Churchill Friday announced an agreement under which the United States will supply Britain with steel in return for aluminum and tin.

The steel from the U.S. will amount to one million long tons. In return will be 55,100,000 pounds of aluminum and 20,000 long tons of tin from Britain.

A joint communique issued at the White House said the agreements will make it possible for the two countries to carry out "more effectively their common task of contributing to the strength and security of the free world."
