Gehrmann Wins Over Fred Wilt

BOSTON (AP) — Mile King Don Gehrmann rolled merrily along in his pre-Olympic campaign over the week-end by twice nipping rival Fred Wilt in a now-familiar pattern.

Both in Saturday night's Knights of Columbus meet and the Philadelphia Inquirer games 24 hours earlier the Milwaukee flash's finishing kick caught Wilt in the home stretch.

The New York FBI agent pushed Gehrmann to a 4:09.3 effort here while losing by a yard in Philadelphia Fleet Fred chased the Wisconsin ace to a meet mark of 4:10.2, again winding up about a yard back.

Gehrmann's rally here earned him the Thomas J. Fitzgerald Memorial Trophy as outstanding athlete in the view of writers covering the K of C affair.

It was Gehrmann's 13th victory in 17 indoor and outdoor duels between the pair. Denis Johansson, the Finnish exchange student from Purdue, was fourth behind Villanova's Fred Dwyer in the Philadelphia mile and third here.

Court Review Asked Of Indian Fishing Rights

THE DALLES (AP) — The U.S. Supreme Court has been asked to review an Oregon Supreme Court decision involving the 97-year old Indian Fishing Treaty Rights on the Columbia River.

The State Supreme Court ruled last November that oy Hoptowit, Yakima Indian, had a right to fish at any place provided under an 1885 treaty with the federal government.

But the decision held that he did not have the right, as an individual, to trespass on private property while doing business as a commercial fish buyer.

Kenneth R. L. Simmons, Billings, Mont., attorney for Hoptowit, filed a petition with the U.S. Supreme Court for a writ of review.

Ted Kroll Wins San Diego Open

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP) — The golfing band quit California this week, most of them with a sigh of relief.

Monday a chosen few golfers head to neighboring Palm Springs for a two-day \$5000 pro-amateur event at the exclusive Thunderbird Golf Club.

All will assemble in Arizona for the \$10,000 Phoenix Open next weekend.

The newest celebrity in golf—and recipient of a belated invitation to the Thunderbird Club party—is Ted Kroll, a youngish looking man of 32 of Polish descent, from New Hartford N. Y.

Kroll won the \$10,000 San Diego Open Sunday. He led at the start, with a spectacular 65 and he led at the finish with a stubborn, well deserved 70 with rounds of 69 and 72 in between.

The result gave the ex-caddie a 12 under par 276, \$2,000 in cash, and his first major triumph.

Jimmy Demaret, who collected \$2,500 for winning the recent Bing Crosby event, pocketed \$1,400. Just back of him, winning \$920 apiece were Jim Ferrier of San Francisco and young Jay Hebert of Great Neck, N. Y. both at 282.

Gil McDougald, recently voted the American league's top rookie, was a star basketball player in high school in San Francisco.
