Increase Of Jobs
By Spring Looms
In Prediction

WASHINGTON (AP)—More workers are out of jobs now than in December, but the government predicts an increase in employment by spring.

And despite the January drop, employment is still high for the nation as a whole.

Secretary of Labor Tobin said during the weekend a nationwide survey showed 16 large areas have less employment, only two have more than last month.

Hardest hit are important production centers like Detroit, Flint and Grand Rapids, Mich., and Fall River, Mass.

Tobin gave these reasons for so many being out of work now: Growing shortage of materials for civilian industry, forcing production cutbacks as in the automobile industry; lack of consumer demand for some goods; and normal winter lulls in construction, food processing, textiles and tobacco.

more than a million VFW members over the country in emphasizing our rededication to public service."

PORTLAND — Sigfrid B. Unander, above, has submitted his resignation as chairman of the Republican State Central Committee "to take part in the other side of political activity and become a candidate for high public office."

Unander, who has held the chairmanship for three years, announced his intentions in a letter to Republican leaders throughout the state. He did not state what public office he will seek, but persistent reports have him running for state treasurer.
