Latest reports from 31 counties in Oregon indicate that \$245,479.52 has been raised to date from the 1951 sale of Christmas Seals, Frank K. Morrow, treasurer of the Oregon Tuberculosis and Health Association, reports.

"This indicates that the people of Oregon are continuing their tradition of strong support for the work of the association," Morrow continued. "However, many people who intend to pay for their seals have not done so because of the Christmas rush.

"We hope that everyone who has not done so already will send in his Christmas Seal dollars," said Morrow, "in order that the Association's program of tuberculosis prevention through public education may expand in the coming year. We are deeply grateful, however, to the many residents who have already acknowledged their Christmas Seals.
