

Paying Ransom Spy Admission, Russian Says

PARIS (AP) — Russia asserted Wednesday that the United States by paying \$120,000 in fines for four American fliers forced down in Hungary, had admitted they were spies.

Soviet fighters based in Hungary forced down a U.S. Army transport plane, downed the four airmen, on Nov. 19.

They were freed Dec. 28 after the United States paid fines of \$30,000 on each to save them from alternative 90-day prison sentences imposed by a Hungarian military court.

Soviet U.N. Delegate Jacob Malik told the United Nations Political Committee the U.S. "recognized the correctness of that judgment" by paying the fines.

American officials had expressed fear Russia, for propaganda purposes, might claim payment of the fines was an admission to guilt but said they decided to pay any-

Bureau Head Scores Farm, Price Controls

PORTLAND (AP) — The government is fostering inflation by its farm and price controls, the president of the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation said here Wednesday.

President Marshall Swearingen, Salem, told the Multnomah County chapter of the Oregon Republican Club that the Farm Bureau wanted to stop all non-essential government spending.

He included soil conservation payments in this category and called the payments "political hush-money paid to a farmer for something he'd do anyhow if he was left alone—operate his farm."

"There is no such thing as a federal grant. The government just collects the money. Then it takes a 20 to 30 per cent cut in Washington and sends the remainder back—with controls," he said.
