R. M. Tobin, Diplomat, Banker, Passes At 85

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Richard M. Tobin, whose 85 years brought him prominence in banking, diplomacy, politics and the arts, died Wednesday.

He was president of the Hibernia bank, with which he had been connected since he was 23. President Harding appointed him minister to The Netherlands in 1923 a post he held six years.

In 1916, he was chairman of the Theodore Roosevelt Republican League of California. Tobin was married in 1936 to Mrs. James A. Burden of New York.

S. P. Mechanic At K-Falls Held In Wife Stabbing

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — Police questioned a railroad mechanic Thursday about his fatally stabbed wife and the four days he says he cannot remember.

The man is Leroy Plant, 42, Southern Pacific employee, who telephoned police Wednesday afternoon to come to his downtown apartment. There they found his wife, Leola, 48, on the kitchen floor. Coroner George Adler said she had been killed by a stab wound in the heart. He estimated she had been dead four days.

District Attorney D. E. Van Vactor said Plant told this story: He and his wife had a few drinks in their kitchen Saturday evening. That was the last he remembered until Wednesday about 4 p.m., when he awoke to find himself on the bathroom floor. His shirt and pants were bloodstained, and he found a cut on his head, another on the chest and still another on his left wrist. He cleaned up, walked into the kitchen and found his wife's body. He telephoned police at once.

Stabbing Denied
The district attorney said a jack knife and a hunting knife were found in a kitchen waste basket, along with an empty whisky bottle. Plant said both knives were his. Van Vactor said. The railroad man stabbed his wife or cut himself, insisted, however, that he had not.

The district attorney also said that a empty box of sleeping tablets was found in the apartment. Married to Plant about two years, the woman had a son by a previous marriage. He is Alvin R. Hines, who is married and living at St. Helens, Ore.

Officers School Used To Get Back To U. S.
FORT SILL, Okla. (AP) — Men in combat zones may be using the Officers Candidate School at Fort Sill as a means of returning to the United States, an officer disclosed Wednesday.

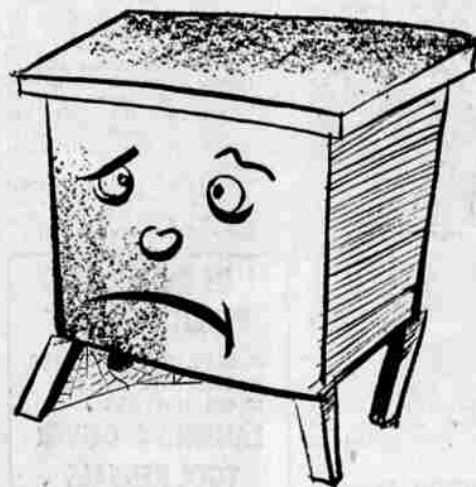
