'Individualism' Myth In Record Of Paternalism

WASHINGTON — President Truman's budget message is a reminder not to get careless with words like "free enterprise" and "individualism" in a country where the government is a real uncle to a lot of businesses and a lot of people.

The message is loaded with special help of one kind or another for various businesses and groups. And it provides as usual for the long-established government agencies which regulate business: Interstate Commerce Commission, Federal Communications Commission, and the rest.

There's nothing new about it. For years Congress has been voting for the help and the agencies. Now, of course, there are added the emergency controls on prices,

wages and materials and special benefits for defense industries. The message, like others before it for generations, merely illustrates again that American business has never been completely free of government regulation or special help. The Constitution itself gives the government the right to regulate commerce.

And from the earliest Congresses which passed the tariff acts, business has received protection from foreign competition. Through the years the help and regulations have taken many forms. For most of our history the help was mostly for business. Help for groups of people has come mainly in recent years.

Economist Quoted
A dozen years ago the American economist, Richard T. Ely, said: "It is not unfair to our political history to say that, next to the defense of the nation, the development of beneficent economic policies has been the chief concern of the United States government."

Among examples supporting his statement, Ely pointed out that the government made land grants of 129 million acres to the western railways and that, between 1870 and 1900, over three million new farms were given away under the Homestead Act.

And over 20 years ago, during President Hoover's administration, the American Historian Charles Beard wrote: "There is some confusion on the subject of individualism and it ought to be examined dispassionately in the light of its history."

In a bitter piece, "The Myth of Rugged Individualism," Beard in 1931 wrote in Harper's Magazine about those, both Presidents and businessmen, who preach against government interference but help to bring it about. And he was caustic about those who oppose government benefits for others but stick their own hand out.

"For 40 years or more," he wrote, "there has not been a President, Republican or Democrat, who has not talked against interference and then supported some measure adding more interference to the huge collection already accumulated."
