

Roller Skating Derby Planned For Three Days

Some 80 Roseburg youngsters, ranging from 18 months into high school age, will take part in the first annual Roller Skate Derby which starts Sunday and continues for three nights.

The show will be presented at the Rolletta Skating Rink at 8 p.m. Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

Sponsored by the Rolletta Dance Club, the show is directed by Ernest Erickson.

In preparation since last fall, the event will be presented in a full pageantry of costumes and will include special colored lighting effects.

There will be sixteen acts in all, including a waltz number, several comedy acts, a 28-girl "dress parade" march, plus several freestyle and figure skating numbers.

Expected to steal the spectators' hearts away will be Lynn Wiley, 18 months old, who is going to get out and skate around the floor just to show that age doesn't mean a thing.

Among the acts will be that of Juanita Archer, 10, and Don Horton, 11, of Roseburg, who won first place in the juvenile dance division of a state contest in Portland last March. The pair also took third place in a regional contest in Vancouver, B. C. and was eligible for the North American contest at Denver. But they were thwarted for lack of funds.

Most of the costumes being used in the show were made by the youngsters or their parents. The first dress rehearsal will be held tonight.

Tickets are being sold by the children taking part and will also be available at the rink. Seating capacity is about 400.

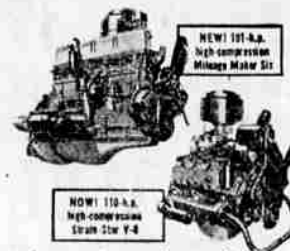

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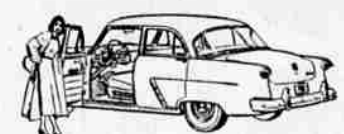
