Three Indicted As Tax Dodgers

PORTLAND (AP) — Four persons, including three from Klamath Falls, were indicted by a federal grand jury Monday on charges of income tax evasion.

Miller E. Cooper, Klamath Falls dentist, was charged with falsifying returns for 1945-1947. He was accused of hiding net income of \$15,963.

Dan D. Liskey, Klamath Falls, was charged with hiding net income of \$75,485 for 1945 through 1947. His wife, Mabel, was charged with falsifying partnership returns to evade payment on taxes on net income totaling \$160,428 for the same period. She also was indicted on a charge of falsifying her personal tax returns for 1947 to hide net income of \$3,141.

The grand jury indicted William Rowland, 55, Cheyenne Indian, on a charge of involuntary manslaughter in the death last November of Mrs. Pauline Isabelle McCorkle, 28, Nez Perce Indian, on the Warm Springs Reservation.

Segregation Blocked Pending Further Report

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court Monday set aside, at least temporarily, a lower court decision upholding segregation of white and negro school children in South Carolina.

The decision—given by a special three-judge U.S. District Court in Charleston, S. C. — was appealed directly to the high tribunal by lawyers for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

By a 7-2 vote the Supreme Court vacated the decision on the ground that the special court had not determined finally all the issues before it.

The special court in its decision last June 21, directed public school officials to report back within six months on what they had done to supply equal facilities for white and negro students.

Monday's brief, unsigned supreme court opinion said the special court has received this report but has not given its own views on it.

The high tribunal said that before it acts on the case, it should have the benefit of the special court's views on the additional facts brought out in the report.
