Klamath County Residents Face Federal Charges

PORTLAND — More federal grand jury indictments of Klamath County residents were disclosed here Tuesday.

Darrell Campagna, Klamath Falls, special officer of the Indian Service, was accused of extorting a payment of less than \$100 from a truck driver. Investigators said Campagna told the driver he had to pay a fee to drive his load of Christmas trees across government property.

Leroy Alvin Hicks, Klamath Falls, was accused of assault with intent to kill two government officers, Virgil Wilson and Don Campagna last November 25.

Also indicted were Harold L. Davis, Klamath Indian, on a charge of assault; Pauline Hendron, Klamath Indian on a charge of stealing \$100 from Elmer C. Manning, Jan. 6; and Ethel Maw Watah, Klamath Indian, on a

charge of attempting theft at Chiloquin last October.

Ruling On Travel Hits Trucks With Explosives

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court Monday upheld a government order requiring truckers to avoid heavily traveled routes while hauling explosives and other dangerous cargoes.

A trucking firm indicated after a load of carbon bisulphide exploded in the Holland Tunnel under the Hudson River on May 15, 1949, contested the regulation laid down by the Interstate Commerce

Commission. About 60 persons were injured in the Holland Tunnel blast.

Justice Clark delivered the 6-3 decision. Justice Jackson wrote a dissenting opinion, joined by Justices Black and Frankfurter.

The truck firm, Boyle Motor Lines, Inc., was indicted by a federal grand jury in Newark on a charge of violating the regulation.

The U.S. District Court dismissed the indictment however, on the ground the regulation did not fix an ascertainable standard of guilt.

Later the U.S. Circuit Court in Philadelphia reversed the District Court. The Boyle firm then appealed to the Supreme Court.
