by the Owen family into which she married.

Her husband, the late Frank D. Owen, was a shoemaker and by avocation a clarinetist. He and Mrs. Owen moved to Roseburg from Walla Walla, Wash., in the early 1900s and engaged in fruit raising and farming on what is now a part of the Veterans Hospital grounds. Mr. Owen played in bands and orchestras conducted by the late F. H. Applehoff.

Mrs. Owen augmented the family income by raising and selling choice flowers. She first had a small stand in a candy store operated by J. A. Colt. As the business expanded, she opened a florist business, first in quarters where Kent's Radio Shop now is located on West Cass street, and later on Jackson street. She sold the business to its present owners Oct. 1, 1922.

Accidents Survived

Shortly after returning to Walla Walla in 1928, Mr. Owen died. Mrs. Owen subsequently was married to Oscar Owen, who passed away about 4 years later.

She made her home for several years with Mr. and Mrs. Clinton Gorthy of Roseburg, and later with a half-brother in Walla Walla. A series of accidents, resulting in broken bones, and failing eyesight, forced her retirement to a Seattle nursing home a few years ago.

She is still mentally active and alert, still interested in flowers, and appreciative of attention from her many friends.

A son Ellis W. Graff, retired school superintendent, resides in Newark, Ohio. She has six grandchildren, one great-grandchild and one great-great-grandchild. Two of her own children and her brothers and sisters have passed away.

The Seattle Times, in a recent interview, quoted her as saying: "I've had my share of troubles—my ups and downs. I like to live and I try hard to do it with all my might. Each day is the best day I can make it."

"You see, I don't live by the calendar at all. I haven't even thought or planned about the last chapter of my life and I never will."

"I've shut the door on yesterday. I am living for today, and I refuse to worry about tomorrow."

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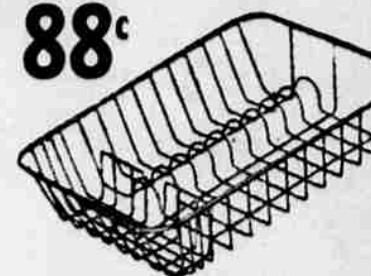
