Rev. Lynn Hodges Gets High Honor In Topeka, Kan.

The Rev. Lynn Hodges, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Hodges, 321 E. 2nd Ave. S., Roseburg, was awarded the honor of "outstanding young man of the year" by the Topeka, Kan., Junior Chamber of Commerce, states a news clipping sent by Hodges to Leroy Hiatt.

Hodges' "Way of Life" broadcasts are heard daily, Monday through Saturday from 6:45 to 7 a.m., over Radio Station KRNR, four Kansas stations and a short-wave station in Ecuador.

The Rev. Mr. Hodges, now 29, grew up in the Lookingglass community, where his family lived until moving to Roseburg in recent years. He is now pastor of the Community Baptist Church at Topeka, is married and the father of three children.

The distinguished service award was accepted for the Rev. Mr. Hodges on Jan. 23 by Charles Hamm, business manager of the North Topeka Baptist Church, as the pastor had accepted a speaking engagement at a religious meeting in Wichita before he learned he was to be honored by the Junior Chamber.

Until shortly before the July flood, the Rev. Mr. Hodges was pastor of the North Topeka Baptist church. He had submitted his resignation to the congregation of that church in June, but withdrew it after the flood to assist the church through its rehabilitation work.

Hodges was characterized as a "leader in the church, a man of God—and a regular guy" by the Junior Chamber member making the presentation.

"With this young man as its tireless leader, his church was the last outpost doing relief work in North Topeka until the waters put it out of business, and it was the first agency to resume relief work on the spot after the water subsided," the news account quotes the speaker as saying.
