Britain's King George Passes Away At 56

proaching death when he bade good night Tuesday night at Sandringham to his Queen and the Princess Margaret Rose.

Unwillingly, George VI became King by a whim of the fates—when Edward VIII, now the Duke of Windsor, abdicated rather than give up the love of the American Mrs. Wallis Simpson.

He lived to see Britain lose much of her empire, and to see his countrymen in wartime valor and peace time adversity.

Voice Betrays Condition

George's voice sounded husky when he broadcast his annual Christmas message, and some specialists saw that as a possible indication that cancer, having been removed from his left lung, was still present in his right.

George VI was the first British king to visit the United States—he was there with his Queen, Elizabeth, in 1939. The new queen went to Washington last year on a side excursion from her trip across Canada.

George V's Queen, Mary at 84 Has Outlived Both Her Husband and Her Son

It was at Sandringham that Edward VIII died, Jan. 21, 1936. Then Edward VIII was king for a few months. The dead king at the time was Duke of York. He became King Dec. 11, 1936, when Edward gave up the throne for "the woman I love," the twice-divorced Mrs. Simpson.

Oakland's New Fire Hall Nears Completion

Workmen were putting the finishing touches on the new Oakland fire hall this week, Mayor John Edwards reported.

The 30-by-50 foot building was started last August to house Oakland's two fire trucks. The structure was built through a \$10,000 bond issue approved by the voters.

Oakland's fire department is on a volunteer basis, Mayor Edwards said, but future plans call for hiring a full time employee.

One of the two trucks has been housed in a warehouse, while the other was parked in the street, Mayor Edwards said.

Elizabeth First Queen To Reign In 51 Years

prince born in Wales who could speak no English.

Elizabeth was marked as a future reigning queen when she was only 10 and her father became King.

It changed the whole course of her upbringing, from that of a relatively carefree child to one laden with the prospective responsibilities of reigning over a world-girdling commonwealth and empire.

Pledges Welfare Reign

On her 21st birthday, she dedicated her life to looking after the welfare of that empire.

In a radio speech from Capetown South Africa, where she and her parents were making another commonwealth tour, she said:

"I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong."

Two events had changed her life from that of a playful daughter of the shy Duke of York.

One was the decision of her uncle, Edward VIII, to quit the throne so he could marry an American, Mrs. Wallis Warfield Simpson, who was unacceptable to the Church of England because she had been married twice previously.

His abdication made her father king on Dec. 11, 1936, and made her the heiress apparent to the throne.

The other event had been the birth of her sister, Princess Margaret, only other child of King George and his queen. Had this child been a boy, he would immediately have taken her place in line of succession.
