

Special Session To Assure Cash Now Advocated

SALME (R)—Deputy State Treasurer Fred Paulus advocated Monday a special session of the Oregon legislature to save the state from possible financial disaster.

Talking to the legislature's interim tax committee, he said a big tax bill could be passed at the special session and the bill then could be referred to the people at the general election next November.

That way, Paulus said the 1953 legislature would be assured of enough money to operate for the following two years.

Sen. Dean H. Walker, Independence, senate tax committee chair-

man, said "what we fear is that the 1953 legislature might pass a tax bill, and then it would be referred by petition to the general election in 1954. If that occurred, we would have to operate without funds during the 1953-55 biennium."

In Oregon, the legislature can't put an emergency clause on a tax bill. This fact leaves all tax bills wide open to the referendum.

Paulus told the committee that the state might have to go on a warrant basis because it won't have enough revenue in 1953, unless new tax sources are found.

This poor financial situation, Paulus said, has caused bond buyers to reduce Oregon's credit rating to that of the lowest group of states.

The reduction in credit rating means that the state will have to pay more interest on its bonds.

Fire Guts Max Factor Beauty Establishment

Mrs. Kadar Not Present At Rites Of Slain Child

PORTLAND (R)—Mrs. Jada Kadar, accused of the first degree murder of her 3-year-old daughter, Sherrie Ellen, did not attend the little girl's funeral here Tuesday.

But Arthur "George" Dollarhide, the child's father, and several hundred others, mostly the curious, did. Dollarhide, sobbing, was led from the chapel by relatives after the brief service.

Sherrie was buried with a bouquet in her hand and a teddy bear beside her. Many who walked past the casket wept. A little girl, about Sherrie's age, was lifted to her father's shoulder so she could see better.

Mrs. Kadar, who now is a patient in a hospital, was taken to the mortuary Monday to see her daughter's body.

The child's body was found in a drainage pit last week, Vickie, Mrs. Kadar's other daughter, said. Mrs. Kadar threw Sherrie there,

police said. Mrs. Kadar said Vicki killed Sherrie and she was trying to save the body.

Paralytic Walks After Fall From Wheel Chair

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. (R)—Betty Postema, who six years ago thought she would never walk again, is out of her wheelchair Tuesday.

The pretty 22-year old Calvin College secretary had been paralyzed from the waist down from a fall while she was in high school.

Doctors held no hope for her recovery. But Betty completed her education and went to work.

Then, last April she fell from her wheelchair on the steps of a college building.

She landed on her spine, and Betty said, "life just seemed to flow into my legs. The more I exercised the stronger they got."

Surgeons said the second tumble apparently freed adhesions.

Now Betty, after months of practicing in secret, is walking again. She says:

"It was something that happened in God's providence."

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
