The black, brown and white mongrel is on the job 15 hours a day, seven days a week sniffing out heated journals. She's a whiz on air brake inspections, too. Fellow workers say she can detect the slightest air leak.

Queenie works with the carmen, but her most constant working partner is August C. Kroeger.

She trots ahead of Kroeger while he inspects the trains. When she comes to a hot box or an air brake

line leak she signals the carman with loud barking, and stays there until help arrives.

Queenie is strictly a freight train specialist.

"She won't have a thing to do with passenger trains," says Kroeger.

Airplane Flying Over Wilderness Tract Protested

CHICAGO — The Izaak Walton League of America wants the U.S. attorney general to stop airplanes from flying over Minnesota's million-acre Superior National Forest.

President Truman issued an executive order in 1949 which prohibited private or commercial flying over the roadless, wilderness tract. The order became effective Jan. 1, 1952.

The League, in a letter to Attorney General J. Howard McGrath, Thursday asked him to halt "illegitimate violations" of the order. It said certain groups have "consistently opposed all efforts to maintain the integrity of the wilderness" for "dollar profit motives."

The League said the flying ban resulted from public demand that the area be maintained "an untamed wilderness serving its highest use for recreation and scientific study." The President acted under

authority granted him in the Air Commerce Act of 1926 to establish air space reservations over government land "for military and other governmental purposes."

The region is accessible only by canoe or airplane.

"This area must be maintained as at least one place where a man and his family, or a troop of Boy Scouts, can know what it is to travel the wilderness waterways by canoe, reach into remote lakes and woodlands, and enjoy pristine recreation. . . ." the League wrote.
