

Central Catholic Tops Prep Fives

For the third successive week, Central Catholic of Portland is rated as Oregon's No. 1 high school basketball team.

The Rams, with 13 wins in 14 games this season got all but two of the first place votes of sportswriters and sportscasters in this week's Associated Press poll. A 74-49 victory over Salem last Friday strengthened their prestige.

Central Catholic has completed the toughest part of its schedule. Its remaining games are with Gresham Tuesday night, Salem, Hood River, Oregon City, Columbia Prep and Concordia.

There were no newcomers to the top 10 this week, although some shifts in the order occurred.

Retain Rankings

The first and second place teams in the Portland League, Cleveland and Lincoln, retained their No. 2 and No. 3 state rankings, in that order. Cleveland, undefeated in high school play, got the other two votes for top spot. Both teams face a tough second-round league schedule, but are expected to finish one-two in the Portland race and win berths in the state tournament.

Wade (Swede) Halbrook, seven-foot one-inch Lincoln center who has rolled up 555 points in 15 games will be closely watched by prep fans as he shoots for new individual state and city scoring records. Marshfield, favored to fight it out with Reedsport for the Southwest Oregon district title, advanced to No. 4 in the poll after winging two more games.

McMinnville fell from fourth to fifth after being upset by Oregon City. Klamath Falls and Medford, fighting it out for the Southern Oregon district crown, ranked No. 6 and No. 7, respectively.

Salem Drops

The thumping by Central Catholic knocked Salem from fifth to a tie for No. 8 with Baker, which won the two week-end games in the tough Eastern Oregon competition. La Grande, also victor in a pair of contests, maintained its No. 10 ranking.

Also-rans were topped by Pendle-

ton, another strong Eastern Oregon team, and Reedsport, which won the western sub-district title in Southwest Oregon by trouncing Roseburg.

Wildlife Meet Okays Forest Revenue Aid

CORVALLIS (AP) — The Oregon Wildlife Federation has endorsed a program which would set aside 10 per cent of national forest revenues for recreation and wildlife services.

The recommendation was made here Sunday at the close of the federation's convention.

A resolution calling for deer season to open Oct. 1 was tabled. Among speakers was State Game Director Philip Schneider. He said 60,000 buck were bagged in Oregon last year.

Ross Brown, Albany, federation president, will represent Oregon at the national convention in Miami, Fla., next month.

Champ Kid Gavilan Slates Williams Bout

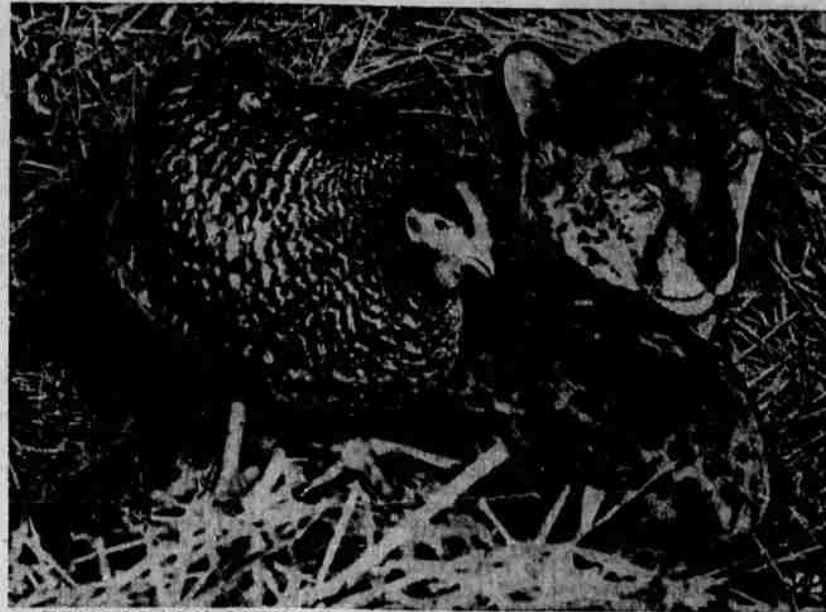

Crosby Files Application For TV Station Rights
