**Barber Still Charges 10 Cents A Hair Cut**

BEDFORD, Pa. (AP) — There's a barber in the nearby western Pennsylvania community of Woodbury who doesn't know the meaning of at least one word under the 'i's in the dictionary.

He's Daniel N. Byers and the word is i-n-f-l-a-t-i-o-n. Now 63, Byers still plys the trade he began 69 years ago. And, he still gets the same pay as he did then—ten cents per hair cut.

"Just never saw any reason to charge more," is the way Byers explains.

**OPS Announces Rise In Clean Potato Price**

PORTLAND (AP) — The Office of Price Stabilization Monday an-

nounced a 20 cent price increase on 100 pounds of potatoes, if they are washed clean.

Carl Donough, district OPS director, said Washington, D. C., sent word that the increase could be applied to all grades and sizes of potatoes harvested last year. It is effective immediately.

Donough estimated that the increase would mean only a fraction of a cent added cost at the retail level.

Donough said no price increase is being allowed for new potatoes.
