Extra Holiday Pay For Federal Jobs Is Denied

WASHINGTON (AP)—Thousands of wartime Army and Navy civilian workers won't get extra holiday pay they've anticipated for the past month.

Comptroller General Lindsay C. Warren said Tuesday claims had poured into government offices since January when the supreme court ruled some government printing office employees are entitled to premium pay in addition to regular pay for holiday service from the fall of 1943 to the fall of 1945.

Warren's ruling in effect says: No contract, no case.

Both the high court and the court of claims concluded that journeyman printers were entitled to more money because of a holiday clause in a 1924 wage agreement. It provided time and one-half pay for actual work on a holiday, in addition to regular pay for that day.

But the Army and Navy reported no such agreement affecting their employees existed prior to 1946.

Warren said that, since 1938, the per diem Army or Navy worker has received only regular pay for a holiday whether he worked or not, and added:

"The decision of the Supreme Court does not require any change."
