

Beavers Fall To Vandals, 46-43; Vikings Hammer Sutherlin, 53-38

Idaho Trails Washington Two Games

It will be Idaho and Washington down to the wire in the Northern Division, Pacific Coast Conference, basketball race.

The Fighting Vandals from Moscow, Idaho, edged Oregon State 46-43 Tuesday night for a split in their two game series here.

The victory put Idaho two games back of the defending champion Washington and set the stage for a title battle in the crucial series with the Huskies at Moscow Friday and Saturday.

Both the Huskies, the No. 8 team on the Associated Press poll, and the Vandals have four games left on their schedule. But the Vandals must win all four to tie Washington for the lead and force a playoff for the championship.

Kept In Running
Last minute baskets by Hartley Kruger and Harlan Melton kept Idaho in the running Tuesday night. Oregon State led 43-42 with about a minute left when Kruger tipped in a rebound. Melton followed with a free throw.

Kruger led the scoring with 22 points. Danny Johnston was high for Oregon State with 13.

The Washington State Cougars, their last four league games scheduled for next week, stepped out of the conference Tuesday night and clipped the Whitworth College Pirates 62-57.

The Cougars led until the last three minutes when Whitworth tied the score 52-51. WSC nipped the rally and went ahead to stay. Whitworth Center Ralph Polson led the scoring with 27 points. Eric Roberts and George Rosser scored 17 points each for Washington State.

Jump To Lead
Led by Jerry Jones, the Viks stomped Sutherlin to a fare thee well in the first half. They jumped to a 19-6 initial-quarter lead and were on top, 29-9, by halftime.

The Bulldogs caught their breath in the second half, with Kenny Wahl sparking the attack to close the gap to 45-28 by the third-quarter break. Wahl hit two quick baskets early in the fourth to whittle the lead to 45-32, but it was too late to overcome the top heavy bulge.

The Bulldogs tied the score at 2, 3 and 5, but after those early seconds of play the visitors took over.

Jones was high-point man of the night as he played one of his best games of the season. Lee Leisinger led the Bulldogs with 11 points.

Sutherlin won the "B" game preliminary, 34-27.

Another bright spot for the Vikings was the return of Dick Komp. He was a top prospect last year, but broke his arm in football this season.

OSLO (AP)—The flaming Olympic torch, borne high by the first of a gigantic relay of 100 men on skis, started Wednesday on its 170-mile journey from Moregdal, the birthplace of modern skiing, to the opening ceremonies of the winter Olympic games in Oslo.

At the same time the torch left Moregdal, the Oslo Weather Bureau sorrowfully announced there seems no prospect for snow in Southern Norway "for at least three or four days."
This prediction rules out any possibility for good runs for the opening skiing events at Norefjell Thursday.

Browns Are Loaded With Players

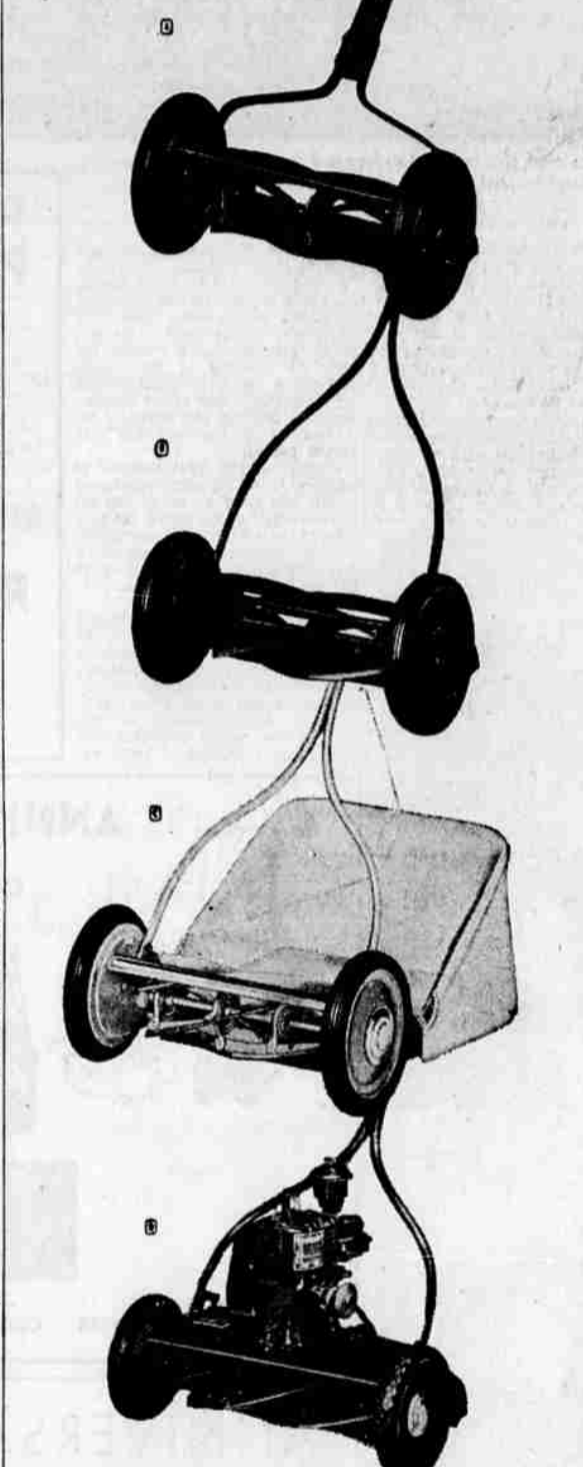
CHICAGO (AP)—The St. Louis Browns, under the tireless maneuvering of Owner Bill Veeck, are the most loaded club in the American League—in number of players, that is.

The 1952 Red Book, official publication of the American League for sports writers and broadcasters only, lists a total of 286 players for the coming season, including 103 rookies.

St. Louis has the heaviest roster with 38 players, and also the most rookies with 17. Other clubs shape up this way: Boston Red Sox 36 players including 14 rookies; Chicago White Sox 37-14; New York Yankees 36-13; Philadelphia Athletics 34-11; Detroit Tigers 33-10; Washington Senators 37-13; and Cleveland Indians 35-11.
