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**SPOT ADVICE**  
HOW TO CHOOSE SATINS  
Satins are, of course, valued for their luster. This quality is acquired by the fabric through any one of several processes, or combination of them.  
In the first place, the oldest and probably still the best way to give luster to satins is by rubbing. At the factory, this is done by "calendaring" — polishing the fabric between smooth cylinders.  
Or the luster may be a combination of sizing and polishing.  
Or it may be merely sprayed on, as in the so called "lacquered" satins.  
This last type of satin is usually unserviceable. Therefore, whether you encounter it as yardage or as trimming on a ready-made garment, you'd be better off not to buy it. Unless the merchant would guarantee it's ability to withstand cleaning.  
Another type of satin recently introduced on the market is the so-called "hammered" satin. Pretty. Until it's cleaned the first time, then the embossed design is no longer there.  
ALWAYS BE SURE TO ASK THE MERCHANT WHAT KIND OF SATIN IT IS, AND WHETHER HE'LL STAND BACK OF IT. If he won't, don't buy it.  
If the satin was made of cellulose acetate rayon, without any admixture of regenerated rayon, its luster can usually be restored.  
If it was unserviceable to begin with — either by reason of poor yarn or excessive sizing, or both, then nothing can be done.  
You see, cleaning is more than merely getting the soil out, and no cleaner in the world can ever make a garment any better than it was to begin with.
