Brief Egg Price War Occurs In Eugene Marts

EUGENE — An egg price war ended here Monday after a weekend in which eggs got down to 10 cents a dozen, and finally were given away—a free dozen with every \$4.50 worth of groceries.

The war started Saturday between two South Eugene markets, across the street from each other. Grade A large eggs, priced at 33 cents a dozen, got down to 25 cents. Then one store cut it to 19, then 10 cents a dozen. That same store began giving them away with the grocery purchases Sunday. The price was back to 53 cents Monday.

Prank In Store Brings Gun Death To Soldier

SAN FRANCISCO — Death ended what Pvt. Robert L. Graves began as a prank. The 28-year-old Korean combat veteran, bound overseas again after an emergency leave, entered a grocery here Jan. 18. As a joke, he snatched up some food and started for the door. But the grocer—a robbery vic-

tim only a few months before—saw no joke. He shouted for help. His son, Eugene Won, 19, came out of a back door shooting. A bullet lodged in Graves' spine. The soldier died Monday at Letterman Army Hospital.

Thirty Credit Assns. Make Good Showing

SPOKANE — Thirty production credit associations in Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana closed 13,195 farm loans totaling \$129,414,295 last year. The Production Credit Corporation of Spokane said Friday it is an increase of \$35 loans and \$29,437,921 in volume over 1950. Montana associations led in the volume of new loans with \$42,059,235; Idaho was second with \$38,115,560; Oregon third with \$35,329,688, and Washington fourth, \$13,909,812.

The corporation said the 30 associations had 8,405 loans totaling \$49,677,991 outstanding as of Dec. 31, 1951. It said 13 of the associations are now member-owned, Great Falls, Mont., and Walla Walla having recently repaid the government investment in their capital stock.

Woman With Hip Broken Suffers 2 Days In Storm

PARKERSBURG, W. Va. — A 58-year-old woman told Friday how she lay outdoors in rain and snow for two days and two nights after breaking her hip. From her bed in a Parkersburg hospital, Mrs. Mary Morehead, a woodcutter's wife, said she left her rural home in Central West Virginia Saturday morning for a five mile walk to the home of a sister, where she planned to spend the weekend. En route, she opened a heavy metal fence gate. It fell on her and in a heavy coat, until Monday, broke her hip. She lay there, clad morning.

Confederate Bills O.K. At Oklahoma Festival

MUSKOGEE, Okla. — First it was a nationwide revival of the Confederate flag. Now, huh, Confederate money is being used here. As part of Muskogee's Mardi-Gras celebration week, some merchants are honoring Confederate bills for part payment.

Physicians said Mrs. Morehead is expected to recover. "I kept trying to move, but I couldn't even crawl," Mrs. Morehead said. "I hollered for a long time, but nobody heard me."

Her sister was not expecting her, so no one was sent to search for her. Mrs. Morehead said it rained and snowed during the time she lay helpless in the field. And she said: "I didn't get so hungry, but I wanted water."
