### Colored People Unit Formed At Eugene

EUGENE (AP) — A chapter of the National Association for Advancement of Colored People was formed at the University of Oregon Wednesday night.

It is designed to aid in solving the plight of Negroes whose housing problems recently were brought to the attention of the public through newspaper articles and meetings.

About 150 students at the meeting named Charles Aull, graduate student from Flushing, Long Island, temporary chairman. City residents as well as students will be eligible for membership, he said.

An Inter-Racial Relations Council also is expected to be formed within a few days to work on the Negro problem.

### Oatmeal Makes Fine Popovers

Believe it or not, light popovers can be made of leftover oatmeal. They are delicious, golden brown, and have a flavor that is particularly good when filled with creamed chicken, ham or seafood.

**Top Hat Oatmeal Popovers (Makes 6 Popovers)**

Once cooked oatmeal, 2 egg yolks, 1 cup sifted enriched flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 cup milk, 2 egg whites, stiff-beaten.

Grease glass custard cups or popover irons and heat in oven while making the batter.

Combine oatmeal and egg yolks. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add with milk to oatmeal-egg mixture and stir in lightly. Fold stiff-beaten egg whites into oatmeal mixture.

Fill hot custard cups or popover irons 2-3 full of batter. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F.) for 20 minutes.

Make a 1/2-inch slit in the top of each popover for escape of steam. Reduce heat to moderate (350 degrees F.) and bake 35 to 40 minutes longer. Remove from baking pan.

Cut the top off each popover and fill with creamed chicken, ham or tuna fish. Replace top and serve as a luncheon dish.

Note: These may also be served plain with butter and jelly as a breakfast bread.

Oatmeal fritters are made of two cups of cooked oatmeal. Served with syrup and crisp bacon they, too, make a fine luncheon dish.

**Oatmeal Fritters (Makes 10 to 12 cakes)**

Two cups cooked oatmeal, 1 egg, beaten; 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 cup flour.

Combine oatmeal and beaten egg; sift together rest of ingredients and add to oatmeal. Beat well. Drop 1/4 cup for each cake into hot fat 1/4-inch deep in frying pan. Brown on both sides. Drain on absorbent paper. Serve with butter and syrup.

### Utility In Law Tilt With City Of Springfield

EUGENE (AP) — Mountain States Power Co. has charged in circuit court that certain Springfield City officials have violated the Oregon and United States constitutions in attempting to take Mountain States property without "due process of law."

The charge is part of an amended complaint filed with the court as the latest step in an attempt by the private power firm to

enjoin Municipal Power from enforcing a safety code ordinance. The ordinance would place the administration of a safety code in the hands of the manager of Municipal Power, a close competitor with Mountain States for the past year.

Mountain States, which claims 2,350 of the city's 3,800 electric users, charged that city officials are attempting to strangle the

private firm by the ordinance. The ordinance would require Mountain States to pay \$1 per pole in fees to replace or install poles and \$5 each for other work applications.

"This would necessitate hundreds of permits at great expense, hindrance, and delay," the power company declared.
