U. S. Skiers Place Second In Olympics

OSLO (AP) — Austria won the unofficial Alpine ski championship of the Olympic games—as expected. The United States took second—as few expected.

Italy ranked third, Norway 4th, Germany 5th, Switzerland 6th, Sweden 7th and France 8th. No other country scored.

The surprises in this list are America's strong performance and the weak showing of France.

The French used to virtually rule Alpine skiing, which consists of slalom, downhill and giant slalom races, while America was just an also ran.

But America suddenly has grown strong and France has declined—its former stars aging and no young one appearing to take their places.

Thanks to its 19-year old wonder girl, Andrea Mead Lawrence of Rutland, Vt., America was expected to do better this year than ever before in Olympic skiing.

Mrs. Lawrence came through as predicted with two first places. But few expected her to get so much scoring help from other Americans.

Katy Rodolph of Hayden, Colo., Imogene Opiton of North Conway, N. H., and William Beck of Kingston, R. I., each chipped in with a fifth place.

Brooks Dodge of Gorham, N. H., tied for a sixth place.

None of these American point winners is older than 22. That's a happy augury for the United States in the next Olympics.

OSLO (AP) — Germany's daring Andreas Ostler clinched an Olympic double Friday by capturing the four man bobsled championship with two dazzling dashes down the snow covered 1,500 meter Frogersteteren chute.

The husky, nerveless 32-year old Garmisch innkeeper followed up his two fine runs of Thursday with a pair of glittering descents that brought his heavily-weighted oak and steel bobbed a whopping victory over Stan Benham's American team.

At their peak, the Germans hit close to 80 miles an hour.

Radio Network Files Suit Against Major League

CHICAGO (AP) — Baseball's broadcast difficulties were further entangled Friday as the result of a \$12,000,000 suit by a big radio network against 13 Major League clubs, their league presidents and commissioner.

The Liberty Broadcasting System filed the suit Thursday in U.S. District Court here. Liberty charged violation of the Sherman and Clayton anti-trust laws and a "continuing conspiracy to monopolize and restrain competition in broadcasting and recreating play-by-play accounts of professional baseball games."

The suit said the Liberty network had been frozen out of the 13 Major League ball parks although it had offered more money than any other bidder for broadcast rights. As a result, the suit said, Liberty has had to cancel plans for its game-of-the-day broadcasts for 1952 and has lost four million dollars.

It asked triple damages totaling \$12,000,000.

Tax Collection Negligence Hits Former Counsel

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Williams (R-Del.) said Thursday that "not one dime has been collected" on tax claims of nearly two million dollars against four taxpayers for whom Joseph C. Nunan got permission to serve as counsel.

In a Senate speech, Williams said that Nunan, a former Internal Revenue Commissioner, and others in his law firm who once worked for the tax collecting agency, have done a "flourishing" business on "tax cases pending before the Treasury Department during their previous (government) employment."

Williams' speech was one of a series of blasts he has delivered against what he terms "scandalous conditions" in the Revenue Bureau. He named these as the four cases:

- Lawrence and Alvin Bardin, of Racine, Wis., brothers.
- The Eulberg Brewing Co., of Portage, Wis.
- The Denmark Brewing Co., of Denmark, Wis.
- The St. John's University basketball team has appeared in ten of the 14 National Invitation Tournaments played at Madison square Garden.

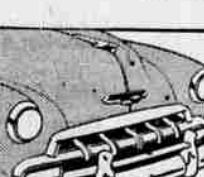

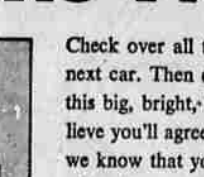
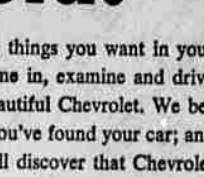
