Try This Green Bean Recipe

For saving kitchen labor, money, and food values often wasted, canned green beans are important. There is almost an over-supply on the market now and that should mean lower prices.

Canned beans come julienne style, whole, or cut in 1 1/2-inch segments. Here are recipes that make the most of them.

Bean and Chicken Casserole (4 servings)
One cup soft bread crumbs, 2 tablespoons butter or fortified margarine, melted, one 1-pound can cut or julienne green beans, 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup, one 6-ounce can chicken cut in pieces, paprika.

Toss bread crumbs in melted butter. Drain beans; add liquid to pan in which butter was melted; cook until liquid is reduced to 1/4 cup. Add soup, beans and chicken; heat. Turn into a shallow casserole. Arrange crumbs in band around edge; sprinkle with paprika. Bake in a moderately hot oven (400 degrees F.) 15 minutes or until bread is brown.

Green Bean Whirligig
One 1-pound can green beans, julienne style, milk, 2 tablespoons butter or fortified margarine, 2 tablespoons diced pimiento, 1 cup prepared biscuit mix, 1/4 cup milk, 2 tablespoons melted butter, 1 cup ground luncheon meat.

Drain beans; measure liquid. Add enough milk to make 1 1/2 cups. Melt butter, add flour and salt; stir to a smooth paste. Add liquid and cook, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens and comes to a boil.

Add beans and pimiento; heat. Turn into a shallow casserole. Combine biscuit mix, milk and butter. Roll into a rectangle 8 x 12 inches. Spread with ground luncheon meat; roll as tightly as possible. Cut in 1-inch pieces; place on top of hot mixture. Bake in a hot oven (450 degrees F.) 25 minutes.

To keep costs down but spirits up, serve slightly novel budget meat dishes for Sunday.

Choose filling, flavorful casserole dishes and prepare them perfectly. Everyone will be pleased and well nourished without straining the budget.

Lamb Afghanistan (Serves 4)
Two pounds stewing lamb, lean, 3 scallions, stems and bulbs chopped, 2 tablespoons olive oil, 2 bouillon cubes, 1/4 teaspoon thyme, 1/4 teaspoon caraway, one No. 1 can okra, 1 can tomato paste, 1 1/2 cups water, 1 orange; grated rind

and quartered, 1/4 teaspoon marjoram, salt and pepper.
Sauté lamb and scallions in olive oil in iron skillet, turning frequently, until well browned. Transfer to deep casserole; add other ingredients, stir together and simmer in oven at 350 degrees F. for an hour and a half. Serve with fluffy rice or rice pilaf.

Barbecue Sauce
Three ounces (1/2 can) tomato paste, 3 ounces of water, 1 medium onion, 1 medium green pepper, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard, 1/4 teaspoon celery seed, 1 tablespoon wine vinegar, 1 tablespoon malt vinegar, 1 tablespoon olive oil.
Stir together tomato paste and water; add to finely chopped onion and pepper, then add seasonings, vinegar and oil. Mix well and place in refrigerator until needed.

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Bestardy Charge Hits U.S. Troops In Japan

TOKYO (AP) — The newspaper Yomiuri stood firm Monday behind its assertion that U.S. troops had fathered 200,000 bastards in Japan since the end of World War II. It said the figure was based on off-the-record data supplied by Japanese government officials.

The officials, it said, declined use of their names because they feared the "displeasure" of the occupation.

Another Japanese newspaper, Tokyo Shimbun, said the 200,000 children were listed on government food ration rolls.

A U.S. occupation official and a Japanese government authority said the figure was far too high. "It's way off the beam," said an American officer in the Public

Health and Welfare Division of occupation headquarters.

He said the situation was "no worse here than in any seaport in our own country." He refused to be named.

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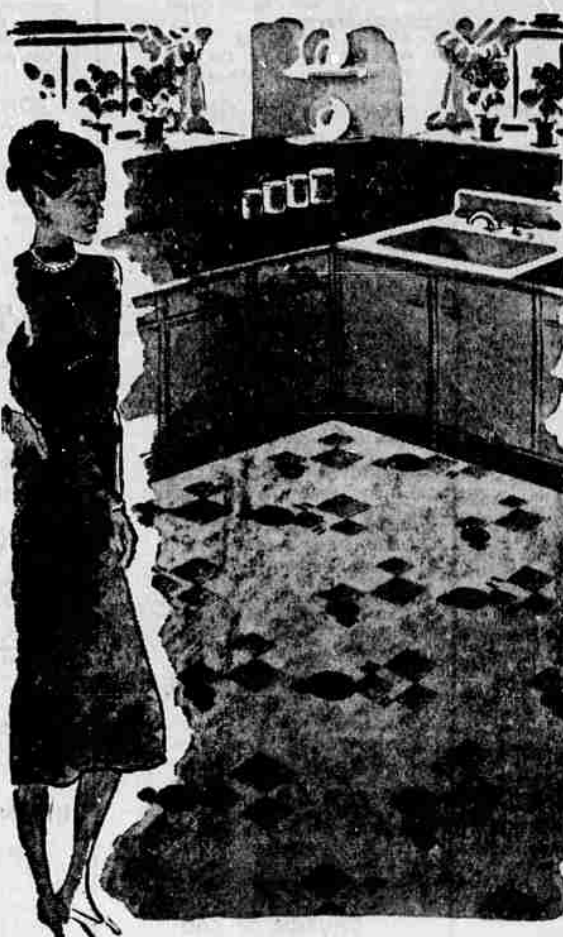
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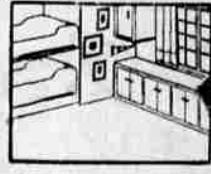
