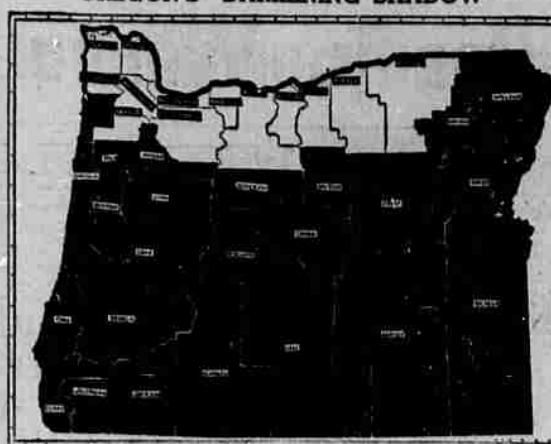

The total tax bill on Oregon people for fiscal 1952, has been estimated by the OREGON VOTER to be \$728,000,000, — all federal, state, local, direct and indirect taxes and fees of every kind.
