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## U. S. Grabs Second Spot In Winter Olympic Meet

OSLO (U. S. P. —) The City of Oslo wrapped up the 1952 winter Olympic games Monday but there was a lot of trouble getting the final knot tied.

The United States played Canada to a curious 3-3 draw and picked up second place in the Canadian's championship in the hockey tournament Sunday night for runner-

up honors to Norway in the final standings for the 10 days of competition.

The hockey game was supposed to have been the final competition in these king-sized games, which drew a record entry of 1,178 athletes from 30 nations.

Monday was reserved for the colorful formal closing spectacle and the awarding of medals under the floodlights in Bislett Stadium.

But the organizing committee found itself with two hockey games to be played. They will affect third, fourth and sixth places in the tournament standings.

Poland tackles Norway in the morning and can take sixth place by winning.

**Play Off Tie**

Czechoslovakia and Sweden were ordered to play off their third place tie at Jordal Stadium only two hours before the closing ceremonies are scheduled to start.

To top it off the Czechs don't want to play. They claim since

they beat the Swedes 4-0 Sunday night the game is unnecessary.

The International Ice Hockey Federation said it was necessary under a brand new rule passed last week.

The rule requires playoffs when two teams are tied for one of the first three places in the European, World and Olympic Championships.

The present tournament counts for both the World and European titles.

A goal by Jimmy Sedin of St. Paul, Minn., with less than three minutes to play, saved the Americans from being involved in the ruckus, the draw gave them one point.

That meant silver medals and raised the United States final overall point total to 88 1/2 — Their best for any winter Olympics in Europe.

The second place hockey finish also qualified the best Americans ever have done.

**Report Winners**

The host Norwegians, far and away the biggest point scorers, won their customary first and second places in the ski jumping Sunday before 150,000 onlookers—the largest crowd ever to see a winter Olympic event.

The Norwegians have won the first two places in jumping in four of the five previous winter Olympics and they've always carried off the first place gold medal.

Arr. Finn Bergmann beat out Norwegian Champion Thorbjorn Falkanger for first place and two more of their countrymen placed in the first six. That gave Norway 18 1/2 points and a grand total of 125 1/2.

The United States was an easy second in the point department, followed by Finland with 72 and Austria with 60.

Uncle Sam's sons and daughters won four first-place gold medals and produced their first double ski winner—Andrea Mead Lawrence, victorious in the women's slalom and giant slalom.

The other American winners 500 meter speed skating and Dick Button of Englewood, N. J., in the men's figure skating. Button was the only 1948 Olympic champion to repeat. Five others tried.

### O'Brien Holds Scoring Crown

SEATTLE (U. S. P. —) Johnny O'Brien, jumping-jack Seattle University guard, owned a new national collegiate single season basketball scoring record of 970 points Monday.

The 5 foot 9 youngster with springs in his legs broke the old mark of 967 Saturday night against Portland University with a 37 point performance. George King of Morris-Harvey was the record-holder he overtook.

But despite O'Brien's 71 points in two nights at Portland, his club lost both games, 63-55 and 93-80, to dim its hopes of a bid to the NCAA regional tournament at Corvallis, Ore., next month.

The South Amboy, N. J., twin, who teams with his brother at guard for the Seattle U. Chieftains, has two games left against Portland here Thursday and Friday to become the first player in collegiate history to score 1,000 or more points in a single season.

### Riddle Jayvees Win Over Camas Valley

Riddle's Jayvees won a "B" basketball league contest for the varsity Friday night. They invaded Camas Valley to eke out a 32-28 decision which counted toward pushing the Irish into a first-place tie with Glendale.

Ralph Rhodes paced the uneasy attack with 24 points. Camas Center Ronnie Defferding racked up 22 for the losers as both squads closed out their regular league seasons.

The varsity was busy at Canyonville making up a postponed contest.

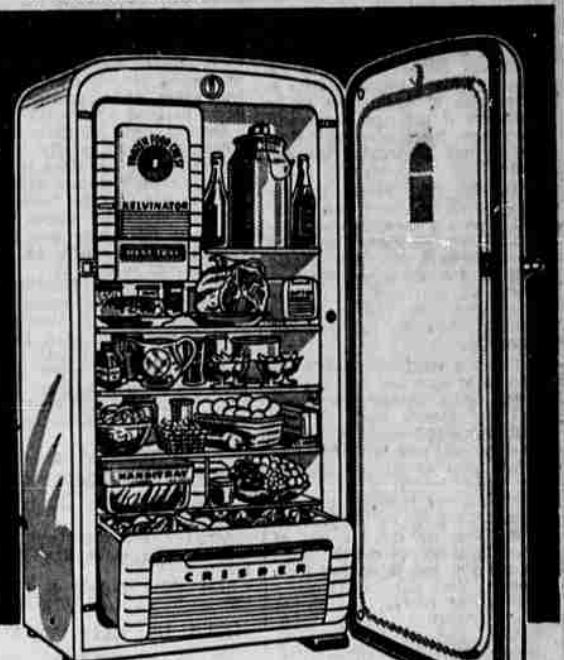
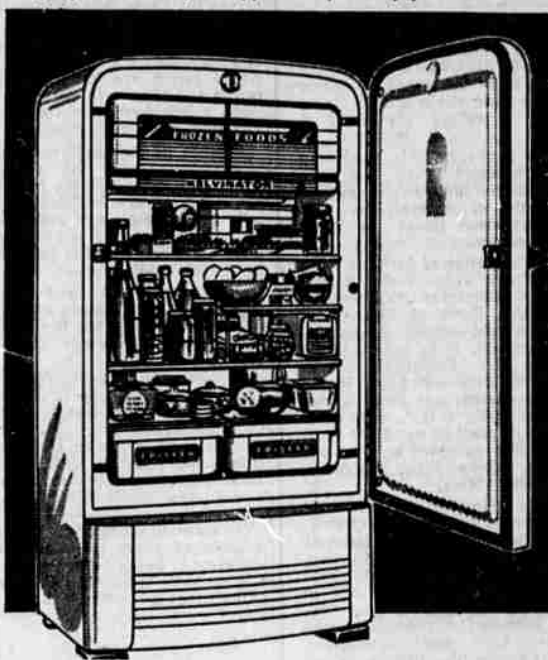
