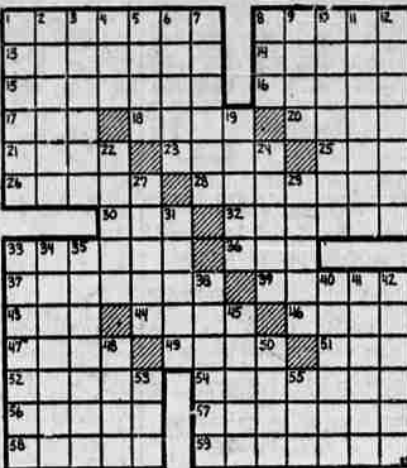
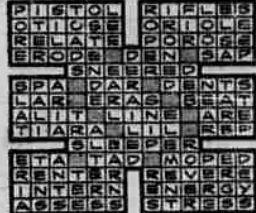

Delinquency Row:

(This is the first in a series of three articles dealing with the problem of delinquency in the county)

Youngsters from all over the county are funneling into a classification that can be called "Delinquency Row."

Smoking cigarettes, drinking beer and hard liquor and driving fast

Here are two teen age boys about 14 or 15 years old. They're carrying something—loaded revolvers. Ask them and they'll say they've got the guns "for protection."

They stole the guns from one of their fathers and hunched rides all over the state, and took part in numerous petty thefts. They look as though they haven't washed their faces in two weeks. Police arrest them as they try to hitch-hike near Roseburg.

And over there on Douglas County's Delinquency Row is a high school youth brought before Judge Carl C. Hill in juvenile court proceedings. He's admitting that he was a member of a southern Douglas County "sex club," composed of high school boys and girls and some persons slightly older.

He's telling the judge how the group met periodically at an abandoned shack on the South Umpqua River and how their parties began with drinking and wound up in wild sex orgies. Police broke up the group and nothing more was said.

A little farther down Delinquency Row are three girls recently expelled from one of the county's high schools. Two of them are 16 years old, the other 14. Police started searching for them one day when they left home and had not been seen since. They were found at Crescent City—two of them registered at a hotel with men—registered as "husband and wife." The third girl slept alone. School officials immediately expelled them when they heard about it. It was another of the many sex delinquencies that wind up on police records frequently.

Leaves Drunken Mother

Here's a youngster you can feel sorry for. But, nevertheless, he's part of Delinquency Row. His mother on one long continual drunken spree, the youth got fed up and left home.

He found another "home"—in the basement of a farm house. The occupants of the house didn't even know he was there. The youngster, who made above-average grades at school, passed five worthless checks.

But he didn't use the money for beer, or for a wild party. He very logically used it for food and clothing. Juvenile authorities in this case put more blame on the parents than on the youngster and granted him probation, placing him in a foster home.

No Delinquency Row would be complete without mention of some of the wild automobile trips that frequently occur.

In one such case three boys and two girls—ages ranging from 15 to 17—started out one night on what was to be a pleasant evening of entertainment. They got



tail of 20 cases came from there, while in more-populous Roseburg, 26 cases were cited in juvenile court.

Figure for other areas—Reedsport 2 cases, Sutherlin 7, Myrtle Creek 13, Green 10, Wilbur 3, Glendale 5, Days Creek 3, Idleyld 1, Winchester 1, Drain 1, Melrose 2, Camas Valley 1, Riddle 1, Glide 1 and Umpqua 1. Nine others were picked up in Douglas County for crimes committed elsewhere.

Of the 20 cases from Winston and Dillard, six were serious enough to be committed to training schools. Sixteen of Roseburg's 27 cases were committed, indicating kids may be getting away with more at Roseburg than at Winston and Dillard, Judge Hill commented.

Tomorrow's article will deal with what officials believe are some of the causes of juvenile delinquency.
