NEW YORK — Baseball's spring training camps will not look quite the same when they officially open Saturday—missing will be some of the games' brightest stars.

Familiar faces that will not be on hand when the gong sounds include Joe DiMaggio, Charley Keller, Tommy Henrich and Ted Williams.

DiMaggio, Keller and Henrich, the great New York Yankee outfielders of the early 1940's all have retired. DiMaggio hung up his glove at the end of last season. Keller drew his unconditional release from Detroit and Henrich resigned as a Yankee coach.

Williams, recalled by the Marine Corps, hasn't decided whether to play with the Boston Red Sox until he reports for duty.

Also missing from the Red Sox camp is Bobby Doerr. The great second baseman called it a career during 1951.

There's a star missing at the Brooklyn Dodger camp at Vero Beach, Fla. Don Newcombe, crack right-hander, reported for Army duty Tuesday.

Rex Barney, potential Dodger star, will not be seen at the Brooklyn camp either. Wild Man Barney will attempt a comeback with Brooklyn's St. Paul club.

Service calls probably will limit the activities of Gerry Coleman of the Yanks and Lloyd Merriman of Cincinnati. Both have been recalled by the Marines but expect to play as long as possible.

## City Bowlers Break Records In League Play

Records fell like the tenpins they involved at the Roseburg Bowling Alley Monday night.

Teams especially found new pin-topping capacities in the regular City League round. Umpqua Chief Flour bowlers rolled a new team series record for the season in whitewashing Lem's Music Repair. They rang up a 3,086 in three games. Only one man on the team had less than a 500 series. Individual games for the series were: 1,021, 1,054 and 1,011. Royd Bruton scored a 624 for the Flourmen.

Meanwhile, league-leading Gilkeson Station broke the season game record with a 1,141 series. It had a total series of 3,079 in winning two games, tying a third and taking the series from Douglas County Realty. In all, the 12 league teams scored eight 1,000-or-better games in the blistering night's play.

On an individual basis, Verdun Boucock of Gilkeson was the marvel of the evening. He recorded a smashing 287 game and a 650 series. He stated out slow with a 172, gained momentum with a 211 and then closed out the evening with his glaring high game.

Beside Bruton and Boucock, Earl Sargent of Mobil Gas also scored over 600 with a 604. Seventeen over-200 games were recorded in the amazing night's play. Schmidt of Firmin rolled a tremendous 254 and Bruton of Umpqua Flour had a 245, both of which were outshown by Boucock's 287.
