

Violations Of Oregon Labor Law Reported

SALEM — State Labor Commissioner W. E. Kimsey said Wednesday he has found several violations of the State Wage and hour law in Portland.

So far this year, Kimsey said, he found 27 children under 18 years of age working in Portland without work permits. Downtown Portland theaters accounted for more than a third of the violations.

Two employers were found to be paying less than the minimum hourly wages, and another was ordered to establish a regular pay day as required by law.

A sound motion picture in color, "I Saw Petra", a film prepared by Dr. Louis T. It was inhabited from time to time by its original founders, by the Egyptians, the Romans and the Crusaders. Literally dug out of rock, there are some 500 temples and a great amphitheatre there.

An interesting phase is the rainbow coloring. The prophetic outlook of the film is a special feature. Many Bible students feel that the city of Petra has been preserved because of the part it will play in coming events.

W. Germany Hit By Nationalism, McCloy Warns

BONN, Germany — U.S. High Commissioner John J. McCloy predicted "general disaster" Wednesday unless reviving German nationalism is halted.

He accused most of West Germany's political parties and even some Cabinet ministers of fostering the revival.

It was McCloy's sharpest warning to date against the trend to nationalism.

It came in his quarterly report to the State Department.

Commenting on another aspect of the German scene, McCloy said East Germany's controlled economy in its fight for industrial self-sufficiency during 1951 may have equalled the 1938 output in that section.

In West Germany, he added, industrial production is at a higher rate than in any pre-war year and West Berlin's economic activity has reached its highest level since the end of the war.

Democracy's Death Planned

With his warning against reviving nationalism, McCloy also spotlighted the emergence of Neo-Nazi parties, which he said intended to "discredit and destroy Parliamentary democracy" in West Germany.

Of the German parties he said: "Most of the established political parties have been stocking the merchandise of nationalism."

"Individuals or circles and, in a few cases, even the controlling elements of an entire state political organization have expressed highly nationalistic sentiments, either out of conviction or as a vote-getting device."

"Even some federal ministers have not been above such actions," he warned.

"The use of the extreme nationalist narcotic creates the need for larger doses. Worse, the users must ultimately find that they cannot subsist on talk alone but must re-
