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M'Arthur, Taft Stay On Oregon Ballot, Ruling

SALEM, Ore., (AP) — Gen. MacArthur's name must remain on the Oregon Republican presidential primary ballot, despite his request that his name be withdrawn, Atty. Gen. George Neuner ruled Monday.

Neuner's opinion upheld a long-standing principle that no person may withdraw his own name from an Oregon presidential primary if that person is entered by petitions signed by 1,000 voters.

This principle also has been endorsed by the Oregon Supreme Court, which ruled in 1916 that Charles Evans Hughes couldn't withdraw his name from the state's Republican presidential primary.

Neuner's opinion also means that Sen. Taft of Ohio won't be allowed to withdraw his name. Taft has said he doesn't want to enter in Oregon, but petitions are being circulated to put him on the ballot.

The deadline for filing in the May 1 primary is next Friday.

Besides Gen. MacArthur, the other Republican candidates entered in Oregon are Gen. Eisenhower and Harold E. Stassen. Eisenhower's name was put on the ballot by petition, while Stassen filed his own named Monday.

Attlee Admits Pact With U.S. To Cross Yalu

LONDON (AP) — Clement Attlee admitted Thursday that his Labor government had made a secret pact with the United States to strike at Communist air bases on the "far side of the Yalu River" in the event of heavy air attacks on U.N. forces in Korea.

The former prime minister insisted, however, that this meant "no departure from the general policy of confining operations to the Korean theater of war."

Attlee's statement was seen as a move to prevent an open split in Labor party ranks after Prime Minister Churchill's disclosure of the agreement in the House of Commons Tuesday.

Churchill's revelation in answer to "warmongering" charges against him caught some of the Laborites by surprise—especially the faction led by left-winger Aneurin Bevan.

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
