Centennial Queen Contest Rules, Regulations Listed

The queen chosen to reign over the Douglas County Centennial next Labor Day week-end will have to conform to a set of rules and regulations, according to the board of directors of the Umpqua Cavalcade.

With the scholarship of \$500 and the wardrobes to be awarded the queen, will come certain requirements and a good deal of work. In order to qualify, the candidate must be unmarried, (not married now and has not been married), a resident of Douglas County since June 1, 1951, and between the ages of 1 and 22. Candidates must be sponsored by an organization, group of organizations, community or town. Sponsoring organizations must designate a manager who will direct the campaign for the candidate. No entry fee is required.

Voters are secured by the individual candidates and their organizations by selling emblems of the Umpqua Cavalcade. The emblems will be provided in various forms such as large decals (colored transfers suitable for store windows, truck panels and other large surfaces), small decals suitable for passenger car windows, bumper strips and art goods, such as souvenir ash trays and plates. Each sale of the advertising material produces one vote for the candidate.

Communities or towns outside of Roseburg who may desire to have elimination contests within their own area are asked to do so. All votes secured by their collective candidates will be accepted on June 14 as votes for a single winner of such regional contest and so entered in the ballot.

The contest will open and the sale on all items will begin Thursday, May 1, and will close midnight of June 14. The seven contestants having the highest number of votes will be declared the princesses of the Umpqua Cavalcade. The queen will be selected from the princesses by the guests at the Queen's Ball and coronation to be held Aug. 2. The selection will be on the basis of beauty, talent and popularity. Beauty and talent shall be judged by five impartial judges who shall remain anonymous. Popularity shall be determined by the ballots cast by those present. The winner will be announced with appropriate ceremony.

Candidates for princess or queen are not permitted to pool votes to gain an advantage for themselves or for another candidate. The Royal Court of the Umpqua Cavalcade including the Queen and her six princesses will be honored at each showing of the Umpqua Cavalcade. Each princess will be entitled to receive special merchandise gifts and services from local Roseburg merchants, and merchants of other cities and towns in Douglas County.

The Royal Court will serve as official representatives at other celebrations throughout the state. All of their expenses will be paid. Girls will be properly chaperoned at all times.

Sponsorship groups may include schools, clubs, professional societies, service clubs, fraternal organizations, churches, granges, trade organizations, veterans groups, communities, industrial concerns, commercial establishments, towns, geographical areas, language or national groups.

All candidacies should be filed by April 28, and their credentials carefully examined by the queens committee. A meeting will be held the night of April 30. There are no restrictions as to

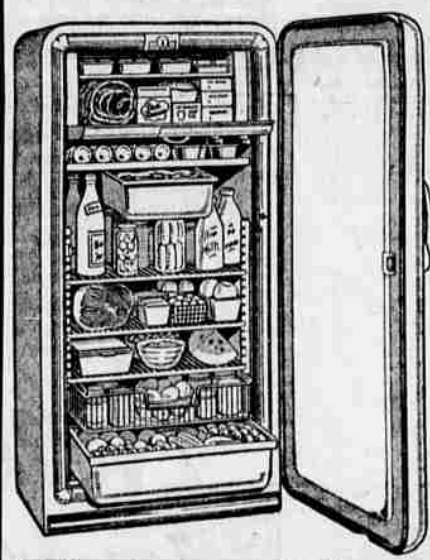

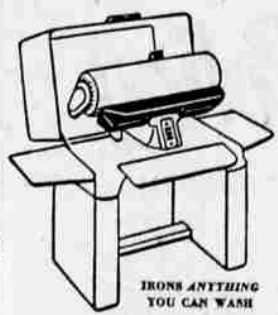
