Expected Baby Of Woman Keeps Jurors In Seats

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — An expectant mother threw the otherwise very dignified Oklahoma County District Court into a dither Monday.

And since women jurors are new in this state, two judges found it difficult to cope with the problem. Judge Glen O. Morris offered to excuse the lady when she announced she will have a baby in May. The lady said nothing of the sort. She wanted to be a juror. Another judge, W. A. Carlile, tried the first case, and to his dismay the opposing attorneys had

no objection to the expectant juror. As the case drew to a close, Carlile was extremely troubled. To reach the jury room it is necessary to climb a flight of steep stairs. The judge finally threw aside all court tradition, cleared the courtroom, and allowed the jury to deliberate in their seats.

Observers had predicted "complications" when the new jury law went into effect, but the judges hadn't anticipated this one.
