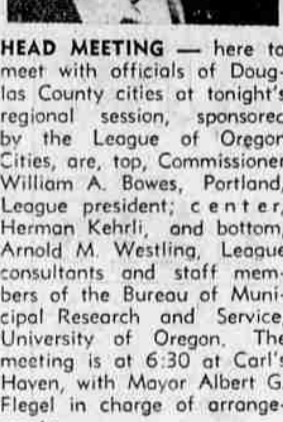

### Allies Firm On Prisoner Swap Issue

Wasting Their Time On Terms Proposed, Communists Told

MUNSAN, Korea (AP) - Allied truce negotiators told the Reds Thursday they were wasting time trying to get "the unconditional repatriation of all prisoners we hold in exchange for a small portion of those you hold."

That's what the latest Red plan amounts to, said Rear Adm. R.E. Libby, and it is not acceptable. The Communists insist that prisoner exchange plans be adopted before turning over a "complete and bona fide" prisoner roster.

SEoul, Korea (AP) - American and Turkish troops stopped a Red assault battalion in its tracks Wednesday night in the heaviest Communist attack in a month. A U.S. 25th Division officer said 200 of the 750 attacking Reds were killed or wounded.
