Norway's War-Time Prime Minister Dies

OSLO, Norway (AP) — Johan Nygaardsvold, 73, Norway's war-time prime minister in exile, died early Thursday in a hospital at Trodheim after four weeks' illness. When the Nazis invaded Norway in 1940, Nygaardsvold, then prime minister, fled to form a free government abroad. He returned at the war's end in 1945.

An active Labor Party politician he had headed the government from 1935 until 1945.

Chicago Health Board President Indicted

CHICAGO (AP) — An indictment charging Dr. Herman Bundesen, president of the Chicago Board of Health, with misconduct in office was returned Tuesday by the Cook County grand jury.

The indictment, charging malfeasance and nonfeasance, in connection with Illinois' horse meat scandal, was returned before Chief Justice Thomas Kluczynski of the criminal court. It was reported voted last week.

Youth Group Members Listed At Rose School

Rose School students are well represented in youth organizations. School Principal E. S. Hall, in a survey conducted recently, compiled the following figures on youth group membership.

Of the 120 girls registered in the school, 80 participate in Blue Bird and Camp Fire girl activities and 120 attend Sunday school.

Boys in the school number 119, and 65 are enrolled in Cub and Boy Scout work. One-hundred-six are registered in Sunday schools.

Hall said the "figures are important and would seem to indicate a correlation between membership in youth groups and membership and attendance in Sunday schools."

Pentagon 'Propaganda Mill' Being Studied

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Herbert (D-La.), Friday promised more detailed study of a "Pentagon propaganda mill" he said employs at least 182 men and costs over one million dollars a year.

Hebert released a list of names and salaries of Pentagon public relations officials during a hearing Thursday by his Armed Services subcommittee on military buying.

The list, supplied by the Pentagon, is incomplete, Hebert said. It shows that 60 civilians, receiving a total of \$364,090, annually, and 128 officers are assigned to public relations duties.

Hebert said the subcommittee would look into this organization further in about two weeks, after completing the present phase of its inquiry into military buying practices.

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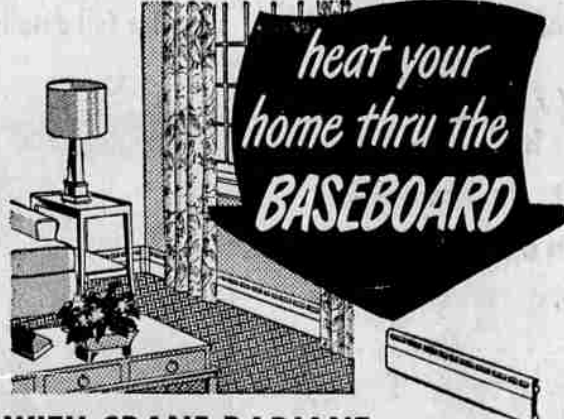
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
