Dentists Want Rule Removed From U. Of O.

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon Dental Association Thursday threatened to go to court to seek removal of the Oregon Dental school from jurisdiction of the University of Oregon.

The threat was contained in a letter to Edgar W. Smith, president of the State Board of Higher Education, protesting the board's recent refusal to withdraw control of the school from the university.

The letter was signed by Dr. J. H. Rossman of Portland, head of the State Dental Advisory Council, an appointive body that asked the board to reconsider the refusal.

Rossman's letter said that legal action would be taken to determine "whether or not the board is violating the law when it placed the dental school under control of the University of Oregon."

"It is not educationally possible for the board to obtain a true presentation of the problem of the dental school when it is presented by the president or dean of another institution under your control," the letter said.

Dr. Rossman said dentists feel the school is handicapped by being required to act through Dr. H. K. Newburn, president of the University.

State Board Moves To End Dam Dispute

SALEM (AP) — The State Hydroelectric Commission proposes to settle the Pelton Dam case in the near future.

The commission said Thursday that if Portland General Electric Company and the State Fish Commission cannot settle the point at issue in the next 30 days, then each side should submit arguments to the Hydroelectric Commission.

The commission said it was prepared to issue a preliminary permit for construction as soon as P.G.E. meets the Fish Commission's demand for protection and preservation of fish resources in the Deschutes and Metolius Rivers.

P.G.E. has federal authorization to build the dam on the Deschutes River, but the Fish Commission has continued to oppose the project.

Governor McKay said earlier this week, however, that he felt the Fish Commission and P. G. E. were getting close to an agreement.

Diphtheria Cases Put U.S. Ship In Quarantine

HONOLULU (AP) — The attack transport USS Bayfield was under strict quarantine here Friday as Navy medical experts baffled an outbreak of diphtheria among members of the crew.

Eleven men were carried from the ship to Tripler General Hospital. Navy spokesmen said seven cases definitely are diphtheria and the other four may be.
