

Oregon Will Insure Private Plane Pilots

SALEM (AP) — Pilots and observers using private planes in air search missions will be insured from now on by the State Board of Aeronautics, the board announced Friday.

W. M. Bartlett, board administrator, said the insurance is being written by Lloyd's of London, and that Oregon is the first state to have it.

It provides for public liability insurance of \$100,000 to \$300,000, and property damage insurance up to \$50,000 on each plane.

Each pilot and observer will be insured for \$10,000 against death or injury.

Bartlett said the next meeting would be held April 2 at the Troutdale airport.
