Attorney Who Exposed Revenue Mess Quits Job

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Charles O'Garra, the young assistant U.S. attorney who first publicized the Internal Revenue Bureau scandals here, quit his government job Friday.

He said, in effect, that he had been given the "silent treatment" by his superior for the past six and a half months.

"I have received no assignment and therefore no longer have any reason for remaining in office," he said in a statement prepared for newsmen.

O'Garra, on his own initiative, presented evidence to the grand jury about irregularities in the Internal Revenue Bureau.

And on Aug. 31, 1951, he appeared before the Senate Finance Committee at Washington, D.C. A federal judge cut short his grand jury appearance on grounds he was not authorized. The case later was presented by another assistant U.S. attorney.

O'Garra said U.S. Attorney Chauncey Trammuto had recommended his dismissal to Attorney General J. Howard McGrath, and had not given him a single assignment for months.
