**Roseburg Man Returns From Overseas Duty**

Sgt. Tyrus Lovelace, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. G. Lovelace of Roseburg, recently departed from duty with Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway's Honor Guard Company in Tokyo to return to the United States.

Lovelace, a veteran of Korean combat duty, served with the Honor Guard as a platoon sergeant.

During the early part of the Korean campaign, he was a member of the 1st Raider Company, serving with that unit for seven months prior to joining the Honor Guard. While in Korea he was awarded the Korean Service Ribbon with three campaign stars and one arrowhead, representing an initial assault on an enemy-held beach.

A graduate of Eugene High School and former student at the University of Oregon, Lovelace en-

tered the Army in 1948 at Fort Ord, Calif. He arrived in the Far East in 1949.

**Evangelism Program Set By Methodists**

With the coming of Dr. Roy A. Fedje of Portland as the guest leader and some nine other Methodist ministers of churches from Elkton on the north to Days Creek on the south and their respective guest leaders, Roseburg Methodism will begin operations Friday March 21 as a "secondary center" of the United Evangelistic Mission of Methodism in the Pacific Northwest.

Final preparation will be made for these Umpqua Methodist Churches to participate in this program of evangelism that has been moving across the denomination, at a banquet Friday at 7:30 p.m. in the First Methodist Church. All of these ministers participated in a similar mission in the Portland area just a week ago. The mission now moves out into the remaining portion of the state.

It is a program of united sharing, witnessing and worshipping, says the Rev. W. A. MacArthur. Every Methodist Church in the entire northwest, Washington, Idaho, Oregon, has been, or will be this week, engaged in the program of preaching and visitation evangelism. Each Methodist minister has been a guest leader in some other church as well as a host pastor when his own congregation was involved in the mission.

Dr. Fedje will lead seminars with these pastors every morning on the mechanics of membership training classes, methods of assimilating new members into the organizations of the church and other essentials of good churchmanship. Dr. S. Raynor Smith, superintendent of the southern district will also be in the city during the week to assist in the mission.
