Linfield College Choir Will Sing At Church Tonight

Linfield College's 40-voice capella choir, famed throughout the Pacific states for its annual Christmas and spring concert tours, will sing tonight at the First Baptist Church as part of its March itinerary in California and Oregon cities.

The group, directed by H. Johann Eschbach, choirmaster and professor of music at the McMinnville college will present Bach's "Jesus, Priceless Treasure;" Brahms' "Liebeslieder Waltzer;" and Poulenc's "Communion Service in G."

Other cities on the March tour include Drain, Oregon; and Eureka, Oakland, Alameda, Berkeley, Martinez, Placerville and Redding, California.

The choir participates throughout the year in Linfield campus activities, including special concerts, May Day and at Commencement time. Members wear the college colors in purple cassocks and cardinal stoles. Singers meet daily for rehearsals and also participate in organized group and individual voice classes.

Choirmaster H. Johann Eschbach obtained his Master of Music degree from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago. He studied under Leo Sowerby and Edwin Arthur Kraft, in addition to noted voice teachers. He has been director of the capella choir at Linfield since 1945.

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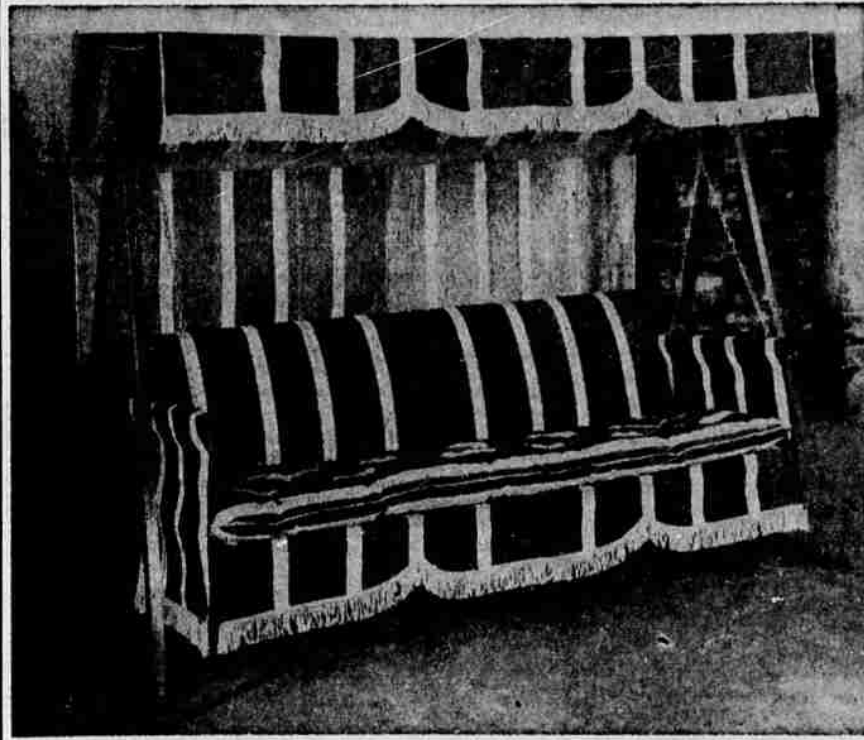
