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Mother Wins Children After 7-Year Battle

SALEM — The Oregon Supreme Court reaffirmed Wednesday its ruling that Tommy and Jimmy Royer must go back to Indiana to their mother, who has tried since 1945 to get them under the Indiana divorce decree that awarded her custody of the two boys. In denying a petition for rehearing by Robert W. Royer-Salem, their father, the Supreme Court said it was ruling in favor of the mother "to discourage kidnapping, as well as contempt for the lawful decrees of a court of a sister state."

The mother, Mrs. Helen A. Lorenz, won Tommy, now 9, and Jimmy, 11, in her divorce case in Allen County, Ind. At that time, Royer had the children in Illinois, and has had them ever since. Both the father and mother have since remarried.

Mrs. Lorenz brought suit in Polk County, Ore., losing there in Circuit Court, but winning unanimously in the Supreme Court.

Royer said the boys can't remember their mother.

"In effect, defendant (Royer) kidnapped these children," Wednesday's decision by Justice Walter L. Tooez, said.

"Our opinion in this case is based entirely upon a jurisdictional question. We do not believe the

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trial court had jurisdiction to inquire into the welfare of these children, and, of course, we have no such authority," Justice Tooez wrote.

"This does not mean, however, that we are not deeply concerned about the welfare of these children. We are. But we are concerned with the highly important principle of jurisdiction."

"It is fundamental that each state should be permitted to determine the status of its own citizens," he said.

Justice Tooez added that to rule in favor of Royer "would not only place the stamp of approval upon kidnapping and contempt, but would make this state a Mecca for all persons seeking to evade the jurisdiction of the courts of the state of their original domicile."

The Justice said that Mrs. Lorenz tried for two years, with the help of a private detective agency, to trace her sons to Oregon.

The court concluded by suggesting that if Royer wants to try to get custody now, he can bring suit in Indiana to try to get the divorce decree changed.

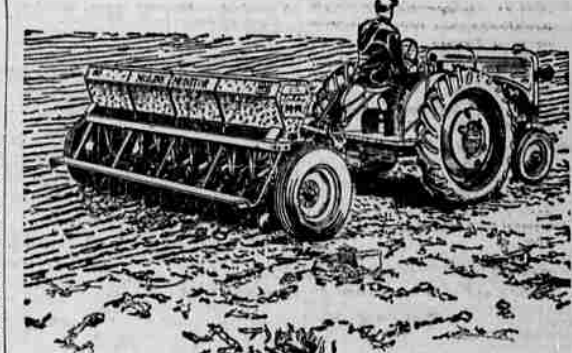
CARDBOARD HAZARD
