

Growth Of Community Increases Juvenile Problems, Officer Says

The juvenile delinquency problem in Roseburg is "more acute" because Roseburg is a growing community, State Patrolman Joe Haystead declared Sunday.

Haystead appeared on the "This Town Is Yours" radio series in an interview with Announcer Bob Grant.

"Roseburg is going through the growing pains stage," the officer said. "It's becoming a big city—and we've got to think in big city terms. We've got to start making plans for parks and recreational facilities."

He said a well-balanced recreational program in the city has definite advantages in curbing juvenile delinquency.

In discussing solutions the officer said the one "closest to his heart" is a spirit of cooperation between parents and the police.

"After all, we're not persecuting them as some people seem to believe," Haystead said. "We're doing what we feel is best for them and the only way we can do that is with the full cooperation of the parents."

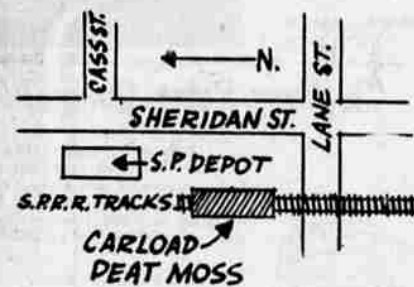

England went up a few pennies Monday. The lords and ladies say times are getting tougher.

Rising costs were blamed for a new boost in prices for the chance to see what Britain's great used to live in. The annual open house season begins Tuesday and a full run of big houses will be available again on a pay-and-look basis, all comers welcome.

The new prices—up seven cents usually—average about 35 cents a visit. And there'll be no free tea. The way things have been in Britain these past few years, many baronial halls and manor houses had to be put on exhibition to help pay the bills. Present occupants generally live in one small wing or two of the great establishments.

French Hand Beating To Indochina Commies

SAIGON, Indochina — The French drove five Vietminh Battalions—about 5,000 men—to the shores of the Gulf of Tonkin Monday night. There the Communist-led rebels battled fiercely to escape destruction.

The French said they had wiped 1,049 Vietminh troops and took 1,062 others in the campaign to mop up rebels from the rich delta rice lands southeast of Hanoi. The drive started four days ago.

With their backs against the sea, the Vietminh were subject to attack from the air, sea and land. The French said they had wiped out or taken prisoner one fifth of the enemy force.

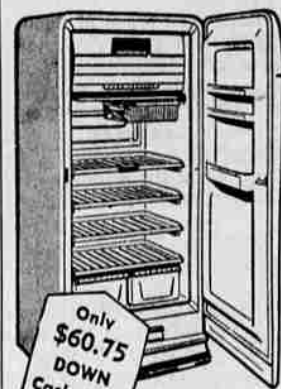
