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Boys Collide Racing For Foul Ball; One Dies

SEATTLE (AP) — A West Seattle High School boy was fatally injured Monday when he collided with another student as both raced to catch a pop foul during baseball practice.

James Morningstar, 15-year-old freshman, was the victim of the accident. He apparently suffered a rupture of an abdominal artery. Assistant Coach John Boitano said the youth was playing catcher during batting practice. He collided with Drew Smith, the third baseman, as they raced to catch the pop fly along the third base line.

Young Morningstar was taken to King County Hospital where he died despite two blood transfusions.

WASHINGTON (AP) — American soldiers like roast turkey the best among all meat dishes, bacon-and-turnip greens the least.

They're strong for fresh sliced tomatoes and buttered corn on the cob, but will have little truck with asparagus or candied parsnips.

Banana cream pie is their favorite dessert, stewed apricots their unfavorite.

LONDON (AP) — A spy scare involving A-bomb research center was exposed late Monday as an April Fool joke.

Three teen agers let the cat out of the bag when they learned they had caused a commotion clear up to the ministerial level of the British Government.

Monday night Harry Sibley, 14, and Neville Thompson, 13, showed up at the Highgate police station with documents marked "Hawwell Atomic Research Establishment" and "burn after reading."

There were a number of blueprints and some dizzying mathematical notations.

The Highgate police put in a hurry call for Scotland Yard.

"We couldn't tell whether it was a formula for atomic energy or lemonade," a detective said.

So Scotland Yard called in experts of the Supply Ministry, which runs the atomic establishment.

They were pretty sure the papers hadn't come from Harwell—'of course this might be the work of some independent private researcher."

"Last night I met Victor Mohra at the Highgate youth club," he said. "Victor's 15. He showed me a buff-colored folder. Inside were typewritten papers with some symbols and signatures in ink. There were also a couple of blueprints."

"Victor said I should take them to the police."

Victor, an apprentice factory draftsman (that's where he got the blueprints), told reporters: "I didn't think it would go as far as this. I made up the bundle as an April Fool's joke at lunch-time yesterday."
