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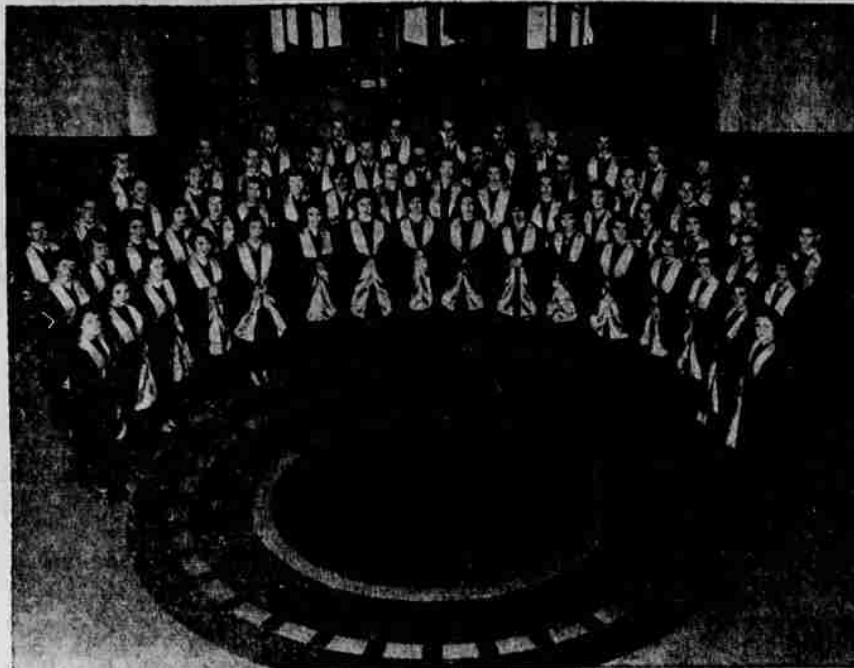
Roseburg Shooters Move Into Top Journal Spot

Favorites Lead Golfers In Meet

PHOENIX, Ariz.—Favorites headed by Defending Champion Mary Ann Downey of Baltimore and Medalist Edean Anderson of Helena, Mont., dominated the picture as a select field of 32 amateurs got down to the serious side of play in the annual Women's Trans-Mississippi Golf Tournament Wednesday.

Match play was the order of the day in contrast to Tuesday's medal qualifying, when nearly 200 golfers of assorted shapes, sizes and swings toured the Arizona Country Club under bright, hot skies.

Par for the 6573-yard course is 38-37-75, and no one was able to shoot under the figure. Only six could hit 80 or better.

Best score, at even par, was the 75 turned in by Miss Anderson, many times winner of the Montana and Utah state titles and a sturdy threat to add the Trans-Miss to her collection.

Miss Downey, who won the title at Quincy, Ill. last year, helped herself to several fat holes and finished with an 81.

Grace DeMoss, Corvallis, Ore., played well for a 79, and Barbara Romack, Sacramento, Calif., still another solid bet, came in with a 78.

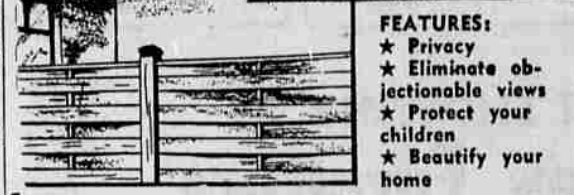
