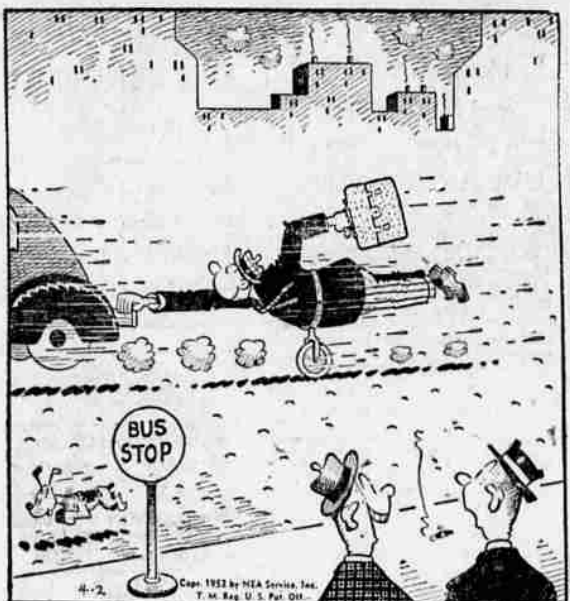

McGrath Balks At Power Given Morris In Purge

WASHINGTON (AP)—Attorney General J. Howard McGrath said Monday he wouldn't appoint Newbold Morris, government corruption cleanup man, as a special assistant if he had to do it over again.

Testifying before a House Judiciary subcommittee, McGrath also said he has not filled out the financial questionnaire sent him by Morris and does not know whether he will do so.

Morris, as his first step in a "clean up" of the government, has sent several thousand top officials a questionnaire asking for detailed information on their outside income and net financial worth.

Morris, a prominent New York lawyer and a Republican, was appointed to the job by President Truman but technically is a special assistant to the attorney general.

McGrath was in the witness chair of the House group which is investigating the way he has run the Justice Department.

Rep. Keating (R-N. Y.), who fired the questions about Morris at the attorney general, told McGrath he understood Morris' deadline for answering the questionnaires is April 7.

McGrath balked at the State Dept. He asked whether McGrath had filled out his yet.

"No, sir," the attorney general replied.

Keating: "You intend to, of course."

McGrath: "I am not sure whether I will or not."

"I haven't decided either whether I'll fill it out or whether I will advise anybody else in the government to do so."

McGrath went on to say he hasn't distributed the questionnaires in his department and will not do so until he decides whether the questions are such that should be asked of government employees.

Morris sent 588 copies of his questionnaire to McGrath with a request that McGrath distribute them to top employees of the Justice Department.

Keating asked whether, in the event McGrath decided to fill out the questionnaire, he would be willing to let the committee have access to the document.

"That's one of the problems I have to decide," McGrath replied.

"If I should classify it as strictly confidential—which I undoubtedly would do if we take that course—the information would not be available to this committee except on direct order of the President."

Keating asked whether McGrath

would object to letting the committee examine his income tax returns.

(It has asked the President for permission to look over the returns of the attorney general and several other officials.)

"I haven't decided on what; I won't say yes or no," McGrath replied.

Oregon Demo Write-In For Eisenhower Urged

PORTLAND (AP)—A supporter for Gen. Dwight Eisenhower Monday urged a write-in vote for the general on the Democratic presidential primary ballot.

W. W. Campbell, Portland, chairman of the Veterans Draft Eisenhower Committee, said he did not believe the Republicans would nominate Eisenhower.

"Obviously the old guard Republicans in control of the party machinery do not like Ike and if they can't get Taft, will probably go for MacArthur," he said.

"Oregon Democrats for Eisenhower have considerable hope that when the Republican convention turns Eisenhower down, the Democratic party will heed the cry of the people and draft Eisenhower," he said.

Margaret Truman Renews TV Contract

NEW YORK (AP)—The National Broadcasting Company has signed Margaret Truman for another year of radio and television performances.

The broadcasting company said Monday she will appear on nine radio and video shows at a salary of \$2,500 each.

EX-EDITOR DIES

PORTLAND (AP)—Charles T. Hoge, 72, a former news and editorial executive for the Oregon Journal, died here Monday, five years after his retirement from the newspaper.

He joined the Journal as a reporter in 1913, and successively became city editor, assistant managing editor, feature editor and associate editor of the editorial page.

The widow and a son, Walter, survive. Funeral arrangements are pending.

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PRAYER FOR NEW BIBLE—Dr. Samuel McCrea Cavert, general secretary of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U. S.
