Ashland Vote Slated On Proposed Hospital

ASHLAND (AP) — The Valley View Hospital Committee hopes to have the question of establishing a Southern Jackson County Hospital district on the May 16 ballot.

Petitions, bearing over 1,000 signatures asking the vote, were filed with the county clerk Tuesday.

County Woodlot Trainer Budget Item Requested

To provide a trained forester to assist farmers in the development of woodlots, the Douglas County budget committee has been asked to include \$3,000 in the new budget.

Directors of the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce voted to submit the request upon recommendation of the agriculture and forestry committees.

The forester would be attached to the county extension agent's staff and would advise farmers in management of woodlots. An amount to match the sum requested will be provided.

Bob McCall, Roseburg Paul Bunyan's Bull, of The Woods, requested financial support for the Bunyan's publicity stunts planned during the year. Directors approved, and voted to request voluntary contributions to back the group's activities.

Committee activity reports were made by the following: agriculture, forestry, industrial and special events.

They revealed plans for a "grass is gold" contest among county farmers; greater emphasis on farm forestry; forestry committee activity on access roads, and preparation of a supplement to the economic and industrial survey to provide close co-operation with the Douglas County Centennial.

Senate Votes Sea Oil Lands' Title To States

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted late Wednesday to give the states—rather than the federal government—clear title to oil-rich lands beneath the marginal seas.

A state ownership amendment was approved by a 50 to 33 vote, as a substitute for a resolution which would have given the federal government control of the off-shore submerged lands.

Although a final vote yet was to be taken on passage of the measure, the action of the states-ownership amendment was seen as a show-down test of the fundamental issue involved.
