## Olympics Beckon College Boxers

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — The Olympics beckoned Monday to nine of this nation's best college boxers and a 10th spunky candidate from the Hawaiian Islands.

The collegians, crowned NCAA mitt champions Saturday night, earned with their titles a chance to compete for berths on the U.S. Olympic team this summer. The 15th annual national collegiate meet was sanctioned by the Olympic committee as a regional qualifying test.

Individual champions are Heavyweight Bob Ranck of Wisconsin, Light-heavyweight Chuck Speiser of Michigan State, Featherweight Neil Ofstun of Minnesota (all three repeaters), Ray Kuboyama of the University of Hawaii, whose flyweight triumph was the first NCAA mitt trophy ever won by an Islander; Frank Schaverria of Idaho, who won with the bantamweight title the John LaRowe trophy awarded annually to the tournament's most sportsmanlike fighter; Archie Slaten of Miami (Fla.), Lightweight; Chuck Adkins of San Jose (Calif.), State, light welterweight; Ellsworth Webb of Idaho State, light middleweight; and Gordon Gladson of Washington State, middleweight.

Slaten punched out the meet's top upset in the semi-finals when he dumped Everett Conley of Washington State, who was seeking his third straight lightweight title.

**Youth Admits Slaying Father Whom He Hated**

BEMIDJI, Minn. (AP) — A 16-year-old farm boy has signed a confession saying he shot his grudge father, dragged him into a barn and dynamited the body. Herbert E. Olson, Beltrami County attorney, said Friday night.

The boy, Lloyd Laverne Knutson, then set fire to the barn in an attempt to hide the slaying, Olson said.

It was first thought the father, Earl Knutson, 57, had been killed when dynamite he used in digging graves accidentally exploded.

"I planned to kill my father for the last couple of weeks because I hated him," Olson quoted the youth as saying.

# Officer Denies Blame For Funds Waste At Base

CASABLANCA (AP) — Lt. Col. Leonard L. Haseman denied Saturday Mrs. Haseman had nothing to do with determining the distance between the houses. He said an architect engineer firm made a mistake by starting to put the houses 25 feet apart instead of the 50 feet specified in the plans.

He said his wife noticed the error and told him about it, "and I had the error corrected."

Colonel Haseman is a U.S. Army engineer recently relieved of his post here by Secretary of the Army Pace in a shakeup following hot congressional criticism of the government's North African air base projects.

Charges were made Monday in the U. S. Senate preparedness subcommittee that Haseman's wife, Violet, known as the "Colonel's Lady," halted a crew of workmen putting up houses at nearby Nouasseur Air Base and arranged for them to start over again to provide more space between her government-built house and other going up nearby.

The subcommittee was told Mrs. Haseman complained that 65 feet was too close and "the plans were redrafted at her insistence" for 120-foot lots causing additional expenses which may range from several hundred thousand dollars to more than a million dollars.

Testimony put in the Senate record said Army engineers and their wives were quartered in Casablanca Hotels, but Colonel Haseman had his government home built on the air base. Contractors said there was no water supply or electric power, so they built a 30,000 gallon tank and hauled water eight miles by truck, and installed two
